1. All District teachers are to use PowerGrade/PowerSchool to record and keep student grades. Parents are to have on-line access to information on student achievement.
2. Only values in column 2, Grades/Rubrics, may be entered into PowerGrade/PowerSchool. Teachers are to convert scores from column 3 to those in column 2 before entering them.
3. For determining student grades, teachers are to use district assessments and classroom assessments.
4. Teachers may weight grades within the two above categories. However, when weights are assigned to common assessment grades, the weights must be agreed upon collegially by all teachers responsible for the specific common assessment.
5. Report card grades issued for courses will be exact averages using Column 2 values carried to the hundredth place.
6. GPA will be calculated using the Grades/Rubric column values carried to the hundredth place.
7. Non-achievement factors including effort, behavior, and attendance may not be included in student grades.

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
