


Current DDA Project

Currently the board has been working with OCBA landscape architects and Progressive AE traffic engineers to create an East End Gateway to the Downtown with a potential road diet and more functional intersection/pedestrian crossing at the Ottawa/Crystal/Chicago Dr location. What year did Jurgens & Holtvluwer open? 1912 (same year the Titanic sank). Do you have memories of being there as a kid? Yes, as a kid I would run around the original store on Grandville Ave after hours while my parents did inventory. My first job was emptying trash cans there for \$2 an hour!


How long have you owned the store? I was partners with my parents for 10 years and the last 8 I have owned the store outright. We appreciate each and every customer, it doesn't matter if you're buying a suit or a pair of socks.

What are you most proud of regarding the store? Just happy to be in business. I was always discouraged from coming into the business because my dad said retail is a tough occupation with long hours. For the first ten years of working here we were open 9:00 - 9:00 Monday through Friday and 9:00 - 5:30 on Saturday. Business took an uptick after the streetscape project and has continued to rise since then.


What would you say is the key to your success? Staying focused on the customer first. It's all about the customer experience. Always!

What do you love about Downtown Grandville? Grandville is a great city for business. The residents are loyal and appreciate what we do. The City and DDA both want businesses to succeed; they are always willing to help.

What do you want others to know about the store? I would like others to know that what *you* want is important to us. If we do not have it, we will try to find it. Everybody is different, so we don't dress everyone the same. We buy styles that you cannot find at mall stores, and we buy only 2 of each tie; that way you don't see yourself coming and going.
