On Oct. 7, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution 2020–28 that states that water, sewer and garbage rates will increase 2% annually beginning January 1, 2021. You will see the increase on your February utility bill that is for your usage in January.

Hopefully we will receive more snow this month. When we do, please remember to not park on the streets and remove trailers, etc., off the road so snow plows have room and access to remove the snow.

### REMINDERS

The City will have a dumpster available for residents to dispose of their real/live Christmas trees. It will be located at 424 E. Clark Street (near the arena). All trees must have ALL decorations removed. It will be available on January 3rd and will be removed on January 11th. This dumpster is for real Christmas trees only.



Grantsville City Council has filled the position of City Manager. We would like to congratulate Jesse Wilson! He is our first ever City Manager. Mr. Wilson is a current resident of Grantsville and was the City's HR Director/Treasurer. Jesse loves Grantsville City and we know he will work hard for our City.

The City will be drilling a well on the south end of town (in the South Willow Estates and Ranches area). This will cause some noise in the area. To try and mitigate the noise, the City will have a sound wall constructed around the drilling site. The drilling will begin January 10th and will take about two weeks to complete.
