Grantsville City will begin selling cemetery plots for the city's 'North Cemetery' on Dec. 1, 2020. This is the area north of the Clark Farm. The cost for Grantsville residents in the 'North Cemetery' is \$700 per plot (\$500 plus a one time maintenance fee of \$200) and for non-residents the cost is \$1700. There are still some plots available in the extension area of the old cemetery. There will be a transfer fee of \$25 per plot (plus the \$200 maintenance fee) for anyone wanting to transfer vacant plots to the 'North' section.
