## FOR YOUR INFO

The City has received questions regarding public utility and drainage easements located on private property. Public utility and drainage easements are specifically designated areas of land for the installation and maintenance of public utilities or storm water drainage. These easements allow cities and businesses to provide important services that citizens use daily. Public Drainage easements run storm water runoff to other locations in town. These drainage easements detail what is and is not allowed, and are located in a note on the recorded plat. Drainage basins or detention ponds also have specific requirements with what can be allowed. Any changes to Public Drainage easements must be approved in writing through Grantsville City before work can begin. Call City Hall to make an appointment with the City Engineer.

Dog licenses are due on March 31st, 2021. Every dog licensed needs a current rabies shot. The cost for licensing is \$15.00 for a spayed or neutered dog and \$25.00 if they are not. There will be a dog clinic on Thursday, March 18th at the Fire Station from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Vet will accept cash and checks only. COVID-19 guidelines will apply.
