If everyone does it voluntarily, we do not have to make it mandatory. The City appreciates the effort everyone is making to conserve water.

REMINDERS

Because we are in extreme drought conditions, the fire danger is very high this year. The City would like to encourage going to the Fireworks show at the Cherry Street Park instead of purchasing your own. To those who insist, please remember that fireworks are **only** allowed in designated spots in the City. See our website for the map. As of now, state code says they can be lit from July 2nd to July 5th from 11 am to 11 pm, (except July 4th, until 12 pm). For Pioneer Day, they are only allowed July 22nd - 25th. HOA's may implement their own restrictions.

Remember SR 112 will be under construction this month. July 9 –July 11, the intersection at 200 West (Tooele) and SR 112 will be closed.
