It's time once again for the City to clean a section of the sewer system. This will begin in November. This year the area to be cleaned will be homes on the west side of Center Street. This will also include all homes on both sides of Center Street. A door hanger will be put on your door a few days prior to the sewer cleaning near your home.

Ace Disposal is adding a day of garbage pick up in Grantsville beginning Nov. 13th. Residents, who formerly had Tuesday pick up, AND live south of Durfee St. AND east of Willow St., will now have Friday as their pick up day. This will also include residents between Willow St. and Matthews Lane. This also takes in Carriage Crossing, Anderson Ranch and Anderson Farms subdivisions. Residents that live on actual Willow Street will keep the Tuesday pick up day. Ace will leave a flyer on each resident's garbage can that will have the day change to Friday. There will be contact information on the flyer for any questions.

*Reminder there is no more bulk pick up. Residents should not put trash/garbage in front of their homes or on the street. Grantsville City has a nuisance ordinance and violators may receive a fine. Let's keep the city beautiful.

Grantsville City's Annual Light Parade will not be held this year, due to the increased number of COVID-19 cases in our area. We regret having to cancel our fun traditions and look forward to hosting them again.

A reminder as our COVID-19 cases in Tooele County have increased, please take the necessary precautions for you and your family to stay healthy and safe.
