# From the desk of the Township Supervisor...

The majority of the commonly asked questions by Grattan residents rarely have easy answers. The most frequently asked questions typically are about roads and the purpose of the DEQ.

The DEQ is now the new department known as Environment, Great Lake and Energy, now referred to as EGLE (pronounced eagle). EGLE's primary job in Grattan is to regulate the use of surface water and wetlands in our Township. The staff of Grattan Township makes an effort to report violations of these two resources to EGLE who in turn notify the violators that they can expect a visit from their office. In the future, the Grattan Township Wetlands Officer, duly appointed by the Township Board, will become more involved with violations and has the power to write citations to violators who refuse to comply with violation notices. EGLE can be contacted at (616) 356-0500.

Grattan Township has their share of gravel roads that never seem to be in very good condition. In the spring and fall they may become nearly impassable. Road maintenance is and always has been the responsibility of the Kent County Road Commission. Township's bear no responsibility to repair roads and receive no funding for road maintenance. The residents of Cowan Lake have approved a special assessment to install a sanitary sewer system to serve the residents of the lake. The projected completion date is the end of 2020.

With the passing of Proposal 3 in November of 2018, any registered voter is eligible to request an Absentee Ballot. Simply fill out the form below and return to the Township to be added to the list.
