

The regular meeting of the Greenville City Council was called to order by Mayor Lehman, in the Council Chambers, in the Municipal Complex located at 415 S. Lafayette Street, Greenville, Michigan 48838 at 7:30 p.m.

4. Councilperson Moss MOVED: The consent Agenda be approved as presented. Councilperson Cunliffe seconded. Unanimously adopted.

New Business

5. Council considered a request by the Greenville Lions Club to construct a pavilion in Tower Park.

Councilperson Johnson MOVED: To approve the request from the Greenville Lions Club to construct a pavilion on "Lions Ridge" as presented. Councilperson Scoby seconded. Unanimously approved.

6. Council considered a request from the Greenville Rotary Club for approval of relief from the no parking ordinance and permission to park their Food Truck on Franklin Street for the Rhythm on the River Concert Series.

Councilperson Moss MOVED: To approve a request from the Greenville Rotary Club for relief from the no parking ordinance and permission to park their Food Truck on Franklin Street for the Music in the Park Concert Series with the following conditions:

- The truck must face the sidewalk so that no customers are waiting in line in the street.
- The truck must have cones around it in a half-moon-like shape for safety, the Rotary will provide the cones.
- There must be "caution drive slowly" signs on the south and north sides, the Rotary will pick those up and drop them off at Public Services.
- The Rotary will provide insurance liability and sign a hold harmless contract.
- The City will provide a parking permit to affix to the food truck as shown in the attachment.

7. Council considered Resolution No. 22-14, a resolution to approve Contract 2022 - 0755 with the MDOT and authorize signators of the said contract for airport runway rehabilitation.

Councilperson Moss MOVED: To approve Resolution No. 22-14, a resolution to approve Contract 2022-0755 with MDOT and authorize George Bosanic as signator of said contract for airport runway rehabilitation as presented:

WHEREAS, the City of Greenville has received MDOT Contract 2022-0755, a contract between the Michigan Department of Transportation and the City of Greenville, to be used for Rehabilitation Runway – Airfield Paint Markings (2022

Statewide – JN 216482), Seal Rwy Pavement Surface/Joints – Airfield Crack Sealing (2022 Statewide – JN 209605).

WHEREAS, MDOT requires the CITY to approve the contract; authorize the signators and certify that the match amount be committed to execute the contract;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the City hereby authorizes City Manager George Bosanic to act as signatory on behalf of the City to execute Contract Number 2022-0755.

WHEREAS, Westview Capital, LLC has deeded, by Warranty Deed, recently completed streets to the City of Greenville known as Strauss Court and Hollyhock Drive.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary to furnish certain information to the State of Michigan to place this street within the City of Greenville public street system for the purpose of obtaining funds under Act 51, P.A. 1951 as amended.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED:

That the center line of said street is described as: A 50-foot wide strip of land in the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 17, City of Greenville, T9N, R8W, Commencing at the N  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of said Section; thence S00°3'16"W, 1887.51 feet, along the North-South  $\frac{1}{4}$  line of said Section; thence N89°56'14"W, 150.01 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence S00°03'16"W, 270.62 feet; thence 63.58 feet along a 55-foot radius curve to the right to Point A, the chord of which bears S33°10'22"W, 60.10 feet; thence S24°47'49"E, 68.69 feet to the center of a 53-foot radius curve, said point being the Point of Ending for Strauss Court. Also, the description for Hollyhock Drive beginning at Point A; thence 51.80 feet along a 55-foot radius curve to the right, the chord of which bears N86°43'46"W, 49.90 feet; thence N59°45'00"W, 215.45 feet to the Point of Ending for Hollyhock Drive.

1. That said streets are located within the City of Greenville right of way and is under the control of the City of Greenville.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary to furnish certain information to the State of Michigan to place this street within the City of Greenville public street system for the purpose of obtaining funds under Act 51, P.A. 1951 as amended.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED:

That the center line of said street is described as: A 66-foot wide strip of land in the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 10, City of Greenville, T9N, R8W; Commencing at the N  $\frac{1}{4}$  post of said Section; thence S1°17’41”W, 330.56 feet, along the north and south  $\frac{1}{4}$  line of said Section, to the Point of Beginning of this description; thence N88°46’13”W, 217.58 feet to the center of a 53-foot radius circle; said point being the Point of Ending of this description.

1. That said street is located within the City of Greenville right of way and is under the control of the City of Greenville.
2. That said street is a public street.
3. That said street is accepted into the City of Greenville Local Street System and was open to the public before December 31, 2022.
