

The regular meeting of the Greenville City Council was called to order by Mayor Lehman, in the Council Chambers, in the Municipal Complex located at 415 S. Lafayette Street, Greenville, Michigan 48838 at 7:30 p.m.

Present: Mayor Lehman; Councilpersons Cunliffe, Barrus, Linton, Moss, and Scoby; City Manager Bosanic, Assistant City Manager Feazel, and Deputy Clerk Schmeltzer.

Absent: Councilperson Johnson

1. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Lehman.
2. Statement of Citizens: Kevin Carlson, 1108 Sprucewood Drive, objected to agenda item D being closed to the public.
3. Councilperson Cunliffe MOVED: The consent Agenda be approved as presented. Councilperson Linton seconded. Unanimously adopted.

The Consent Agenda consisted of the following:

- a. Approval of the minutes from the regular City Council meeting held on August 02, 2022.
- b. Approval of the payroll report for the regular pay period ending August 06, 2022, in the amount of \$146,261.22.

New Business:

4. Council considered an agreement with the Greenville Public Schools to share a Public Safety School Resource Officer.

Councilperson Cunliffe MOVED: To approve the proposed School Resource Officer Agreement with the Greenville Public Schools subject to legal counsel review and conclusion as presented. Councilperson Linton seconded. Unanimously approved.

5. Council considered Resolution No. 22-21, a resolution to Opt-Out of the publicly funded health insurance contributions act for the next succeeding year (Public Act 152 of 2011).

Councilperson Moss MOVED: To approve a Resolution No. 22-21, a resolution to opt-out of the publicly funded health insurance contributions act for the next succeeding year (Public Act 152 of 2011):

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2011 the Publicly Funded Health Insurance Contributions Act, Act No. 152 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 2011 (the "Act"), became effective in the State of Michigan and

WHEREAS, the Act establishes standards with respect to medical benefit plans offered by public employers including standards regarding the amounts that employees contribute toward their medical benefits; and

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Act authorizes municipalities to exempt themselves from the requirements of the Act by a 2/3 vote of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes that, as the elected representatives for the City, it is best positioned to determine what benefits (including medical benefits) ought to be offered in order to attract and retain the best qualified City employees at the lowest overall costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, on the basis of the above circumstance, the City Council resolves as follows:

1. Pursuant to Section 8 of the Act, the City shall be exempt from the requirements of the Act for the next succeeding year (i.e., 2022).
2. All resolutions in conflict with this resolution are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Councilperson Scoby seconded. Adopted with a vote of (6) Ayes: Lehman, Cunliffe, Scoby, Barrus, Moss, and Linton; (0) Nays; and (1) Absent: Johnson.

6. Council considered the award of a contract for professional services for the creation of Historic District Design Guidelines for the Historic District Commission's bylaws.

Councilperson Moss MOVED: To approve a contract for professional services for the development of the City of Greenville's Historic District Design Guidelines to Miller Preservation Services of Howell, Michigan in the amount not to exceed \$6,000 as presented. Councilperson Scoby seconded. Unanimously approved.

7. Council considered a motion to enter into executive session to discuss correspondence from legal counsel in connection with the current Marijuana Laws.

Councilperson Moss MOVED: To approve a motion to enter into executive session to discuss correspondence from legal counsel in connection with the current Marijuana Laws as presented. Councilperson Cunliffe seconded. Unanimously adopted.

8. Council members entered into executive session at 8:08 p.m.

Councilperson Moss MOVED: The regular meeting reconvene. Councilperson Linton seconded. Unanimously approved.
