## **WINTER WEATHER REMINDER:**

Property owners with adjacent public sidewalks are required to remove all snow and ice from them within sixteen (16) hours after a snowfall. If you have any questions, please contact the City of Greenville Code Enforcement at 754-5645.

## **SOME HELPFUL NOTES AND REMINDERS**

### **FIRE HYDRANT SAFETY**

At no time should anyone obstruct the visibility of a fire hydrant. Fire hydrants and the area around them need to remain free of any obstructions making the hydrant easily accessible to our Public Safety Officers and Firefighters.

If there is a fire hydrant located in the vicinity of your home, please help you and your neighborhood by keeping it free of snow and debris.

### **HOME OR BUILDING IDENTIFICATION**

Please be sure to have the proper identification numbers on your home and or building. Numbers must be a minimum of 4 inches in height, be displayed prominently, and easily visible from the street.

### **COMPOSTING SITE HOURS OF OPERATION**

The City of Greenville operates a composting facility located at 1150 Owen Mumaw Industrial Drive. You may bring your yard waste to the site on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays from 10 am to 2 pm (excluding holidays and Danish Festival weekend). The facility opens the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday in April and closes the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday in November.

# 2023 BULK ITEM & TRASH PICK-UP SCHEDULE

## OCTOBER 2<sup>nd</sup> - OCTOBER 5<sup>th</sup>

The City of Greenville offers bulk item and trash pick-up twice a year. Always the first full week in May and the first full week in October.

### Instructions for use of service:

- The bulk item pick-up service is provided to properties located within single and two-family neighborhoods only.
- Items from commercial/industrial properties, apartment complexes, and items brought in from other properties are strictly prohibited. Violators are subject to penalties.
- Bulk items must be placed at the curb **no earlier than 24 hours prior to your scheduled trash day**. Any items set out earlier will be considered in non-compliance and subject to penalty.

### Acceptable Items for removal:

- Residents may place bulk items such as sofas, stoves, refrigerators, water heaters, carpet rolls, etc. at the curb on your **scheduled Trash Pick-up day**.
- Refrigerators, freezers, and air conditioners must be completely drained of freon by a certified technician and must have a certified sticker indicating so.
- If an item is NOT removed during normal removal time, it is likely deemed an unacceptable item. Please promptly remove the item from the edge of the street. Failure to do so will be considered a violation and is subject to penalty. If you are unsure if an item is acceptable, please call the Public Services Department at 616.754.5098.
- Residents or property owners MAY NOT transport items from other properties to another property for pick-up whether those items come from properties within the City or outside the City, only acceptable items from the immediate property are allowed.

### Unacceptable Items for removal:

- Building materials and hazardous materials (i.e. wood, tires, paint, chemicals, etc.) as they are prohibited to be placed in landfills by state law.
- Items weighing over 90 lbs.
- Items not from the immediate property.

# **2023 LOOSE LEAF PICK-UP SCHEDULE** **OCTOBER 16<sup>th</sup> - NOVEMBER 22<sup>nd</sup>**

***Leaf pick-up will follow the same daily route as the Trash Pick-up schedule.***

## **SIX INCHES FROM THE CURB PLEASE!!**

The City of Greenville wants to remind you of the policy for leaf collection for this fall. Please follow the loose-leaf removal process listed below:

- Loose-leaf pick-up will begin October 16, 2023, and end November 22, 2023.
- Please coordinate raking your leaves with the collection schedule illustrated on the Bulk Item & Trash Pick-up Map.
- On curbed streets other than Washington and Lafayette, please rake leaves into the street and separate them from the edge of the curb approximately six inches. This will allow for an efficient pick-up process. Please keep them close to the edge of the street and not into the drive lane of the street.
- On non-curbed streets, please rake leaves to the edge of the street.
- Washington and Lafayette Street residents – please rake leaves to the edge of the terrace but not into the street.
- Property owners who placed leaves in the streets after November 22, 2023, must remove all the leaves in the curbed streets or next to the uncurbed streets, or the City will remove them and charge a \$100.00 removal fee.
- Leaves not collected can be bagged in biodegradable bags and stored at your home for the winter and dropped off the following spring at the City's composting site located at the end of Owen Mumaw Drive (please see attached map for location).
- VERY IMPORTANT: Please do not place any items (such as sticks, brush, or stones) other than leaves in the gutter or roadside during the Loose-Leaf Pick-up. Any items other than leaves will damage the equipment.
- Unbagged leaves are only permitted in the street or roadside during the "Loose Leaf Pick-up Schedule." All other times during the year, leaves are to be bagged in biodegradable bags and taken to the City's composting site or may be set out at the edge of the street during our brush, grass, and leaf pick-up.
