## THE SHENECOSSET COUNTRY CLUB AT NEW LONDON

The Old Harbor Town now has Golf Links that are among the best in America upon which expert Link Builders have lavished their skill and \$300,000 has been spent.

New London is a typical example of the summer resort place that had been completely metamorphosed by the game of golf. Almost from the days of the Pilgrim fathers, New London has been known to the world as a seaport and yachting center, but now it is the home of the Shenecossett Country Club, with golf links that are among the best in America. One hundred and twenty acres of beautiful rolling land were laid out three years ago by this club and during this time, \$300,000 and the expert knowledge of scientific link builders have been lavished on making the Shenecossett links equal to the best in

America. It will take another year or two to bring the links up to the standard set by the club, but in the meantime, New London has entered on an era of golf successes.

The beautiful new clubhouse has proven a big factor in attracting players and new members from all over the country. Perched on the highest point of the golf links and looking off on to Long Island Sound and across to the surrounding country, this low-lying picturesque clubhouse is the epitome of country club construction and furnishing.

Dudley St. Clair Donnelly of New London, planned what many consider

to be the finest golf clubhouse in the country and H. R. Douglas, the builder, carried out Mr. Donnelly's ideas with such skill that the place is beyond criticism, and no less beautiful is the artistic furnishing of the club which was done by Miss Hettie Rhoda Meade, who is one of the well known interior decorators of New York.

Art and comfort are so combined in the clubhouse that one lingers after a strenuous game of golf to refresh the body in the cozy comfort of the place and to feast the eye on its artistic beauty.

From the big central clubroom, with its harmony of warm colors, out

through the woman's rest and dressing rooms, done in soft French grey, to the lockers of most convenient type for both men and women members, there is a consistent scheme of color, and fine equipment that is incomparable.

The doors of the Shenecossett Country Club are hospitably open to players from all other clubs and sections of the country and the club register shows a count of over 1,100 players, since the beginning of June.
