COOK FIRST ROUND WINNER IN TOURNEY

**Local Golfer Defeats Van
Vleck, 2 and 1 at Shene-
cossett.**

Scoring was remarkably low in the qualifying round of the annual invitation tournament on the Shenecossett links here today.

Tommy Armour, the title holder, and Max Marston of Philadelphia, tied for the low medal round with 72's, while Ned Sawyer of Swanoy, Eli Tiffany of Moxawk and Frank Godchaux of New Orleans all registered 75's.

Godchaux is Benton.

The favorites came through on the first round. Alex Armour, however, took Godchaux's measure and found him for a three and one score, on the fifth hole. Armour had to make an eagle 3 to win as his opponent got a birdie 4.

A strange coincidence was that his brother, Tommy Armour, lost this very same hole in his match with Fuller even after he got a birdie 4, one stroke worse than Fuller's eagle 3. The summaries:
