

Public Works: We're MORE than just paving



Passing the new Community Center, drivers may catch a glimpse of a field of pink ribbons. The rows of markers are part of re-grading, or leveling of the site, prior to restoration of a Town soccer field.









MAKING of a RAIN GARDEN: In eligible areas, Roads & Streets can convert a catch basin to a manhole. When paired with a "curb-cut" this diverts stormwater so run-off exits paved areas— no longer through a drain— but into a newly graded channel, or 'swale' (see left & below). Stones may be added to help control erosion. Specially chosen plants are then installed, and at right is the end result, a "rain garden" which does double-duty slowing run-off & filtering pollution.
