




- Existing FYE 2023 budget: \$143,398,970







- Sustainability and Resilience Manager hired in August 2022
- Downtown Mystic Resiliency and Sustainability Plan development underway
- Climate Action Plan development process will be launched this spring/summer
- Youth Climate Summit being planned for fall 2023



Neighborhood Revitalization

Grant Funding for Poquonnock Bridge Village

- \$8.4 million awarded by CT Dept. of Economic & Community Development
- Advances Mixed-Use Village envisioned by 2019 study
- Improves bicycle and pedestrian connectivity
 - Adding bike lanes & sidewalks
 - Poquonnock River boardwalk deck replacement & pedestrian bridge planned
- Supports affordable and market-rate housing: about 250 units total




Bouncing Back

COVID Recovery Through ARPA Funding

- Engaged the Groton community with Budget Simulator to produce ARPA Needs Assessment published in June 2022
- Building a strong, resilient, and equitable recovery by making transformational investments that support long-term growth
- Key investments that:
 - Support local businesses
 - Leverage nonprofit partnerships
 - Contribute to regional recovery and connectivity initiatives
 - Enhance Town of Groton facilities and services for residents
