Monthly Financial Report

The information used to create this memorandum includes data through December 31, 2020. The report is formatted using the same template for the Annual Budget Ordinance providing the original budget figures, revised budget figures, actual revenue and percent of budget received year to date. As a point of reference, there are certain revenues and expenditures (such as sales & use taxes, property taxes, debt service, maintenance contracts, risk management insurance, etc.) are collected/paid quarterly and annually, which may result in the specific percentages appearing skewed as compared with year to date percentages.

- General Fund revenues for the month ending December 31,2020 were \$13.2 million actual.
 This is an increase of \$180,000 or 1% compared to FY20. At this time in FY21 the
 County's total revenue collection is not noticeably different than what was projected for
 the first half of the fiscal year.
- Solid Waste revenues for the month ending December 31, 2020 were \$852,000. This is a
 decrease of \$38,500 or (2.9%) from FY20. The total revenues collected are at 67% of the
 amended budget for the fiscal year.
- Northern Water revenues for the month ending December 31, 2020 were \$246,508. This is
 a decrease of \$37,750 or (9.2%) from FY20. The total revenues collected are at 43% of the
 amended budget for FY21.
- Southern Water revenues for the month ending December 31, 2020 were \$519,550. This is a decrease of \$14,300 or (1.8%) from FY20. The total revenues collected are at 44% of the amended budget for FY21. Due to Governor Coopers Executive Orders 124 & 142 that prohibited the charge of fees on unpaid utility accounts, this reflects in the deficit in collections. Since the County has recently adopted a payment arrangement plan for customers, collection of back owed utilities should be fulfilled by the end of FY21.

Tunis Sewer District revenues for the month end were \$14,125. This is an increase of \$500 or 2.4% from FY20. The total revenues collected are at 38% of the amended budget for FY21

Overall, expenditures throughout the different funds are within estimated levels through December 31, 2020. Expenditures will continue to be controlled and monitored to ensure appropriations remain within approved parameters.

FISCAL YEAR 2021 – 2022 BUDGET DEVELOPMENT SCHEDULE

Manager David B. Cotton, presented the Fiscal Year 2021 – 2022 Budget Development Schedule to the Board stating that the schedule was detailed according to the statutory deadlines and open to change at the Board's discretion.

During the discussion, Chairman Gatling requested that Manager Cotton inform the Tax Collector, Mrs. Tammy Eason, to develop a plan of action to increase the County collection rate for FY 2021-2022 and present that information to the Board during the Budget Work Session, and that aside from the Board choosing the dates for their Retreats/Work Sessions, Manager Cotton could proceed with the items listed on the 2021-2022 Budget Development Schedule.

REQUEST APPROVAL OF CONTRACT FOR AGING SERVICES PROVIDED THROUGH THE OLDER AMERICANS ACT AND STATE APPROPRIATED FUNDS FROM THE NC DIVISION OF AGING JULY 1, 2020 – JUNE 30, 2021

On a motion by Com. Douglas and a second by Com. AUTHORIZING REMOVAL OF CERTAIN PUBLIC RECORD BOOKS KEPT

BY THE REGISTER OF DEEDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF REPAIR, RESTORATION AND REBINDING

WHEREAS, N.C. Gen. Stat. 132-7 provides that books of public records should be copied or repaired, renovated or rebound if worn, mutilated, damaged or difficult to read; and

WHEREAS, there is identified certain books of public records maintained by the Register of Deeds in need of repair, restoration and rebinding; and

WHEREAS, Kofile Inc. RecordSave is under contract to provide repair, restoration and rebinding of those certain books of public records. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for Hertford County, North Carolina, that:

Section 1. The Register of Deeds is authorized to remove or cause to be removed to the care and custody of Kofile Inc. RecordSave, Document Preservation Specialists for repair, restoration and rebinding the following book of public records: Misc. Records, 1947

PERSONNEL POLICY EXCEPTION REQUEST

Clerk to the Board

Manager Cotton presented and recommended to the Board a request from Mr. James Broglin, Hertford County EMS Director, to offer part-time employment to the wife of a full-time employee who would be assigned to work on separate shifts in the EMS Department.

On a motion by Com. Lassiter and a second by Vice-Chair Horton, the Board unanimously approved the request for the EMS Department to employ part-time the spouse of a full-time employee with the stipulation that the Human Resource Director and the EMS Director monitor the department to ensure no conflict of interest practices occur in the department that could undermine the workforce's view of management's commitment to ethics in general.

COUNTY MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Manager Cotton commented he received a request from Dr. William T. Wright, Hertford County Public Schools Superintendent, offering the County Right of First Refusal on real property located at 820 NC 461 in Ahoskie valued at \$31,173.00 that the school system going to dispose of on January 25, 2021.

After discussion, Chairman Gatling advised Manager Cotton that the Board needed additional information regarding the property and the legal process involved.

Chairman Gatling further advised Manager Cotton as follows: the Board is requesting a presentation of the Economic Development Plan focusing on plans and direction of how to shape the goals and objectives outlined by the Board for the County at the upcoming retreat on February 1, 2021; 2020-2021 plans for the Tourism Board advertising; the County Museum establishment; moving forward on the plans for the old Hertford County Courthouse parking lot and building; a report of trends in departments before deficits; continued communication with Hometown Strong personnel; the importance of workshops and goal setting; and stressed that it is critical for the Board to know how citizens and businesses are doing. Additionally, Manager Cotton was asked to reach out to set a gauge on how the County is progressing or digressing; and report to the Board the number of lives loss in the County since the COVID-19 Pandemic. Chairman Gatling concluded by stating the Board wants to see County participation in Holiday celebrations even if participation is with other organizations.

COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS

The Board made the following comments:

Com. Mitchell made no comments.

Com. Lassiter commented Happy New Year to everyone and he was wishing for snow.

Com. Douglas apologized for arriving late for the meeting.

Vice-Chair Horton commented that the recent NCACC Legislative Conference was a great event asked Clerk Fleetwood to share a copy of the approved objectives with the Board.

Chairman Gatling commented as follows:

- advised Manager Cotton to take pictures of the message boards and publicize in the County; make sure the Resolutions for the Tourism Development Authority & HC Museum establishments go before the General Assembly to be presented in time for consideration, the County does not miss the deadline for the PARTF Grant, and work on COVID vaccination sites in the County
- a citizen affiliated with the Robin Institute wants to donate 1,000 facemasks and 2,500 hand sanitizers for the County to dispense to citizens; requesting that Manager Cotton and Clerk Fleetwood be responsible for distributing the donated items
- 3) attended a fruitful meeting this week with Manager Cotton, Clerk Fleetwood and Mr. Peter Griffith regarding the Hertford County Museum
- 4) a wealth of historical documentation was printed in a book years ago by Cal Bryant; he is seeking additional information from Cal through Clerk Fleetwood,
- 5) the County is continuing to solicit artifacts and other items for the HC Museum

Chairman Gatling concluded his comments stating he is excited about capturing the big history for Hertford County.
