### PUBLIC HEARING HERTFORD COUNTY BUDGET HEARING FY 2021-2022

Mr. David B. Cotton, County Manager, addressed the Board addressed the Board highlighting the following: he is pleased to submit to the Board the Hertford County proposed budget for FY 2021-2022; the budget was prepared in accordance with NCGS § 159.7, the NC Local Government Budget and Fiscal Control Act; all funds within the budget are balanced, and all revenues and expenditures are identified for FY 2021-2022; and ultimately, this year's budget document presents the revenues and expenditures by function and purpose.

Additionally, Manager Cotton shared that the recommended budget which comports with the guidance of the Commissioners, is as follows: General Fund - \$27,050,902; Proprietary Fund Solid Waste - \$1,376,685; Proprietary Fund Northern Rural Water District - \$522,973; Proprietary Fund Southern Rural Water District - \$1,021,000; Proprietary Fund Tunis Wastewater District - \$32,543; other Governmental Funds - \$415,621; Total (Inclusive of all, net of transfers) Funds-\$31,227,724 and a tax rate of 84.0 ¢ per \$100 in valuation is proposed for FY 2021-2022.

Chairman Gatling opened the floor for public comments on the proposed budget. No public comments were given.

Vice-Chair Horton thanked Manager Cotton and his staff for the efficient operation of the local government funds.

# REQUEST APPROVAL OF JCPC GRANT CERTIFICATION FY 2021-2022 COUNTY FUNDING PLAN

On a motion by Com. Leroy Douglas. and a second by Com. Lassiter, the Board unanimously approved the JCPC Grant Certification FY 2021-2022 County Funding Plan in the amount of \$126,736 available funding and a local match of \$12,077.00.

# REQUEST APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AWARD OF BADGE AND SALE OF SERVICE WEAPON TO A RETIRING LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

On a motion by Com. Lassiter and a second by Com. Douglas, the Board approved the Resolution Authorizing Award of Badge and Sale of Service Weapon to a Retiring Law Enforcement Officer as presented by County Manager Cotton.

#### RESOLUTION

#### AUTHORIZING AWARD OF BADGE AND SALE OF SERVICE WEAPON TO A RETIRING LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Hertford, North Carolina, has determined that the County owns certain personal property, which has become surplus for the current needs of the County, to wit: the service weapon of Captain Jessie Fennell, who is a retiring law enforcement officer with the County; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute § 20-187.2 permits the County, upon request, to donate the badge by a law enforcement officer to said officer upon retirement; and

WHEREAS, North Carolina General Statute § 20-187.2 permits the County, upon request, to sell the service weapon to the retiring law enforcement officer upon securing such a permit required by law or without such permit if the weapon has been rendered incapable of being fired;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Hertford County Board of Commissioners that a Glock 22, .40 caliber weapon with serial number BKWE904 is declared surplus to the needs of the County of Hertford; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, to honor the service of Captain Jessie Fennell as a law enforcement officer, the County of Hertford authorizes Sheriff Dexter Hayes to donate the badge issued to said officer, and further authorizes the sale of the service weapon described in the Resolution, which is declared surplus, to said officer for the price of \$1.00, with the payment of said purchase price to be waived in consideration of this officer's loyal service to the citizens of Hertford County; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the personal property described in this Resolution is surplus as of June 7th, 2021.

On a motion by Com. Douglas and a second by Vice-Chair Horton, the Board unanimously approved the Resolution Approving the Opioid Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) as presented by Attorney Charles L. Revelle, III.

# A RESOLUTION BY THE COUNTY OF HERTFORD APPROVING THE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT (MOA) BETWEEN THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS ON PROCEEDS RELATING TO THE SETTLEMENT OF OPIOID LITIGATION

WHEREAS, as of 2019, the opioid epidemic had taken the lives of more than 16,500 North Carolinians, torn families apart, and ravaged communities from the mountains to the coast; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has compounded the opioid crisis, increasing levels of drug misuse, addiction, and overdose death; and

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimates the total "economic burden" of prescription opioid misuse alone in the United States is \$78.5 billion a year, including the costs of healthcare, lost productivity, addiction treatment, and criminal justice involvement; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Hertford County have experienced significant negative impacts related to opioid abuse, - including but not limited to health care providers and facilities, law enforcement and EMS services, family crises, mental health and recovery services, addiction treatment programs, courts and criminal justice facilities, and social services programs; and

WHEREAS, certain counties and municipalities in North Carolina joined with thousands of local governments across the country to file lawsuits against opioid manufacturers and pharmaceutical distribution companies and hold those companies accountable for their misconduct; and

WHEREAS, representatives of local North Carolina governments, the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners, and the North Carolina Department of Justice have negotiated and prepared a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to provide for the equitable distribution of any proceeds from a settlement of national opioid litigation to the State of North Carolina and to individual local governments; and

WHEREAS, Local Governments and the State of North Carolina anticipate a settlement in the national opioid litigation to be forthcoming; and

WHEREAS, by signing onto the MOA, the state and local governments maximize North Carolina's share of opioid settlement funds to ensure the needed resources reach communities, once a negotiation is finalized, as quickly, effectively, and directly as possible; and

WHEREAS, it is advantageous to all North Carolinians for local governments, including Hertford County and its citizens, to sign onto the MOA and demonstrate solidarity in response to the opioid epidemic, and to maximize the share of opioid settlement funds received both in the state and this county to help abate the harm; and

WHEREAS, the MOA directs substantial resources over multiple years to local governments on the front lines of the opioid epidemic while ensuring that these resources are used in an effective way to address the crisis.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, Hertford County hereby approves the Memorandum of Agreement Between the State of North Carolina and Local Governments on Proceeds Relating to the Settlement of Opioid Litigation, and any subsequent settlement funds that may come into North Carolina as a result of the opioid crisis. Furthermore, Hertford County authorizes the County Manager (or County Attorney) take such measures as necessary to comply with the terms of the MOA and receive any settlement funds, including executing any documents related to the allocation of opioid settlement funds and settlement of lawsuits related to this matter. Be it further resolved copies of this resolution and the signed MOA be sent to <a href="mailto:opioiddocs@ncdoj.gov">opioiddocs@ncdoj.gov</a> as well as forwarded to the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners at <a href="mailto:communications@ncacc.org">communications@ncacc.org</a>.

Lassiter, based upon the evidence and the statements, presented at the May 3, 2021, Board of Equalization and Review Hearing, by Greg Bergdale representing Wackenhut Corrections Corp and by Bob Pearson of Pearson's. Appraisal Services, which have been reviewed and considered; and considering the recommendation of Mrs. Sandy Brock-Justice, Hertford County Tax Assessor, that there be no change in value because the property was assessed at its highest and best use as an operating prison on January 1, 2021, the Board of Equalization and Review finds and orders that the true fair market value of PIN # 5997-92-6741, Wackenhut Corrections Corporation owner, as of January 1, 2021, is \$52,219,088 and that the origin \$52,219,088 appraised assessment is confirmed.

On a motion by Commissioner Lassiter and a second by Com. Douglas, unanimously approved to adjourn the Board of Equalization and Review for FY 2021 and return to the Regular meeting.

# EMS - PRESENTATION OF LUCAS CHEST COMPRESSION SYSTEM

Mr. James Broglin, EMS Director, assisted by the demonstration of the LUCAS Chest Compression life saving device donated to the county by Nucor Steel, valued at approximately \$16,000.00. Mr. Broglin shared that the device is capable of performing CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) automatically instead of an EMT having to perform chest compressions manually.
