Post Meeting Brief

At the May 2nd, 2022 Board of Commissioners' meeting, professional services agreements were discussed along with essential operational needs being addressed by the Board. The Post Meeting Brief will be published on the County's website, Facebook page and it will be shared with our Sunshine List, media and County staff.

Highlights from the May 2nd, 2022 Commissioners' Meeting:

- As a part of the Consent Agenda, the Board approved the April 4th, 2022 Meeting Minutes and a Taxpayer Refund for an individual.
- Citizen/Customer service is a fundamental tenet of the Board's mission to deliver exceptional services to the community. One practice in support of this core tenet is investing in the County's staff. As a service organization, the Board knows that our success is intrinsically linked to hiring and maintaining a highly motivated and talented staff. One measure that the Board takes each month in demonstrating their appreciation for our staff is the introduction of new hires. This single action demonstrates the Commissioners' commitment to supporting their development and importance to the Hertford County team.
- Commissioners approved Budget Amendment #19 which included debt proceeds for the purchase of a front end loader (Solid Waste) and funding for pre-employment psychological screening totaling \$171,593.
- The Board approved a contract with Thompson, Price, Scott, Adams & Co. P.A. for auditing services associated with fiscal year ending June 30th, 2022.
- The Commissioners conducted a Public Hearing for a rezoning request – property located at 851 United States Highway 13 Ahoskie from Residential Agricultural (RA-30) to Commercial Highway (CH).
- The Board unanimously approved a contract with Professional Staffing Solutions for temporary administrative, custodial and specialty positions.
- The Commissioners enthusiastically approved a Proclamation declaring May 2022 as Older Americans' Month.
- An additional duty and responsibility of the Board of Commissioners is to sit as the Board of Equalization and Review hearing taxpayer's appeals. The Wackenhut Corrections Corporation (Parcel Identification Number 5997-92-6741) appealed the Rivers Facility property.
