### Post Meeting Brief

At the June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022 Board of Commissioners' meeting, the Board discussed scholarships for students as well as routine operational business. The Post Meeting Brief will be published on the County's website, Facebook page and it will be shared with our Sunshine List, media and County staff.

Highlights from the June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022 Commissioners' Meeting:

- As a part of the Consent Agenda, the Board approved the May 16<sup>th</sup> and June 6<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes and North Carolina Vehicle Tax System Refunds for three taxpayers.
- An indispensable component of the services offered by Hertford County is the citizen volunteer. The Board appoints citizen volunteers to a number of committees and boards providing invaluable insight and recommendations. The Commissioners unanimously approved appointments and reappointments to the Choanoke Area Development Association, Choanoke Public Transportation Authority, Hertford County Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) Board, Hertford County Social Services Board, Industrial Facilities & Pollution Control Financing Authority, River's East Workforce Development, Roanoke Chowan Community College Board of Trustees, Veterans Advisory Council and Voluntary Agricultural District Advisory Board.
- The Board is committed to limiting the number of properties owned by the County, which are not essential to providing core services. One such example that demonstrates this commitment is returning foreclosed property to private ownership. The Commissioners approved and accepted the sealed bid from Blue Chip Construction, Incorporated in the amount of \$10,000 for 413 Jim Hardy Road.
- The Board appointed Commissioner Andre Lassiter as the voting delegate representing Hertford County at the National Association of Counties Annual Conference. In addition, the Board appoint Commissioner Leroy Douglas as the alternate voting delegate.
- The Commissioners are committed to supporting the youth of Hertford County. An example of their commitment was on display at the Board meeting. The Board unanimously awarded thirteen students from the Early College High School, Hertford County High School and C. S. Brown High School STEM scholarships of \$1,000 each.
- The Board received the bi-monthly economic development report on the status of several projects and initiatives underway in Hertford County.
- The County Manager provided a brief update on two construction projects requested by the Board.
