### Post Meeting Brief

At the September 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022 Board of Commissioners' meeting, employee recognition, budget amendments along with essential operational needs were addressed by the Board. The Post Meeting Brief will be published on the County's website, Facebook page and it will be shared with our Sunshine List, media and County staff.

Highlights from the September 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022 Commissioners' Meeting:

- As a part of the Consent Agenda, the Board approved the August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022; August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022 Meeting Minutes, a Taxpayer Refund/Release for an individual.
- Citizen/Customer service is a fundamental tenet of the Board's mission to deliver exceptional services to the community. One practice in support of this core tenet is investing in the County's staff. As a service organization, the Board knows that our success is intrinsically linked to hiring and maintaining a highly motivated and talented staff. One measure that the Board takes each month in demonstrating their appreciation for our staff is the introduction of new hires. This single action demonstrates the Commissioners' commitment to supporting their development and importance to the Hertford County team.
- The Board approved two (2) capital projects and one (1) capital investment within the Solid Waste Department. The Commissioners strategically leveraged American Rescue Plan Act funds to repair the exterior (push wall) of the tipping floor at the transfer station, repair the scales and purchase solid core tires for the front-end loader. The combined total of three (3) projects is approximately \$54,000.
- Commissioners approved Budget Amendment #2, which included grant funds for the Sheriff's Office and Social Services funding for the Crisis Intervention Program and the Low Income Energy Assistance Program.
- The Board approved a Right-of-Way Agreement with Dominion Energy to mitigate infrastructure risk by placing power lines underground along Newsome Grove Road.
- The Commissioners approved a General Purpose Contract, Final NC DAAS-731 FY-22 County Services Summary and Senior Center General Purpose Funding Application Packet.
- The Board unanimously approved American Rescue Act Plan funds to assist with the installation of a water well for a resident living along Rea Road.
- In the Commissioners' closing comments, the Board members thanked the citizens in the audience for attending the meeting as well as notifying the public of upcoming events in the community.

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
