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Post Meeting Brief

At the March 6th, 2023 Board of Commissioners' meeting, the Commissioners recognized a group of local scholars. Additionally, routine agenda items and essential operational needs were also addressed. The Board Meetings are held in-person, in the Multipurpose Room/Commissioners Chambers, located on the 2nd Floor of the Judicial Center (119 Justice Drive, Winton). Highlights from the March 6th, 2023 Commissioners' Meeting:

- As part of the Consent Agenda, the Board approved Taxpayer Releases.
- Hertford County Middle School Principal, Terrell Delotach, along with Mrs. Helen Lassiter, Ms. Dawnesha Faison, and a group of about forty of their eighth grade students, all attended the meeting on March 6th. The students were given the opportunity to get a firsthand look at how local government works and how Board of Commissioners Meetings are typically conducted.
- The Board approved Budget Amendment #BA-16 to the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Budget Ordinance. This amendment included funds that were received by DSS for the LIHWAP program and by Aging for funding for Home Delivered Meals, Congregate, and Senior Center Operations. Amendment RR6 was also approved by the Board. This amendment included funds allocated for audiovisual renovations in the Administrative Office of the Courts, which will be mandated across the state.
- Mrs. Orlanda Reed presented the Commissioners with a small token of gratitude on behalf of the Pleasant Plains Senior Club for their generous contribution to the club.
- Hertford County Office of Aging Director, Deda Evans, shared with the Board, on behalf of the Emergency Food and Shelter Board, that Hertford County has been awarded Phase 40 funding. The funding that was received may be used to provide food, shelter, and supportive services.
- "Introduction of New Hertford County Staff" is an agenda item that demonstrates how high the Commissioners prioritize the practice of recruiting and retaining qualified employees. During this meeting, the Commissioners were introduced to a small group of new hires that will be working with the Sheriff's Office, Public Works and the Department of Social Services.
- EMS Director, James Broglin recognized team members from Hertford County E-911 (Linda Morris & Nicole Fennell), Hertford County Sheriff's Office (Sgt. Brian McNair, Sgt. Kendail Swain & Deputy Carleigh Wildeboer) and Hertford County EMS (David Tadlock, Jacob Powell, Kathryn Williams & Keasia Combo) for their exemplary service on a call, which took place on the morning on February 14, 2023.



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
