Vaccine Homebound Program

WHEN YOU’VE BEEN FULLY VACCINATED



- You can resume activities that you did prior to the pandemic.
- To reduce the risk of being infected with the Delta variant and possibly spreading it to others, wear a mask indoors in public if you are in an area of substantial or high transmission.
- You might choose to wear a mask regardless of the level of transmission if you have a weakened immune system or if, because of your age or an underlying medical condition, you are at increased risk for severe disease, or if a member of your household has a weakened immune system, is at increased risk for severe disease, or is unvaccinated.
- If you travel in the United States, you do not need to get tested before or after travel or self-quarantine after travel.
- You need to pay close attention to the situation at your international destination before traveling outside the United States.
 - ◊ You do NOT need to get tested before leaving the United States unless your destination requires it.
 - ◊ You still need to show a negative test result or documentation of recovery from COVID-19 before an international flight to the United States.
 - ◊ You should still get tested 3-5 days after international travel.
 - ◊ You do NOT need to self-quarantine after arriving in the United States.
- If you’ve been around someone who has COVID-19, you should get tested 3-5 days after your exposure, even if you don’t have symptoms. You should also wear a mask indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until your test result is negative. You should isolate for 10 days if your test result is positive.

Ordinance 2021-013

Adds Mecom Way from Jay Road to Highway 6 to No Parking Zones. It Shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle of any type on the street.

Ordinance 2021-014

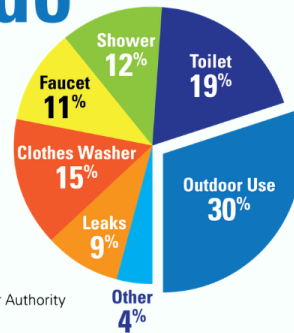
Adds Matranga Street from Schiro Road to Stewart Street to the Twenty Miles Per Hour Zones. The speed limit was reduced from 30mph. to 20mph.
