Committee Members present were Brian Carnes, Larry Honeycutt and Billy Mosteller. Also present were County Administrator Steve Willis, County Attorney John DuBose, Clerk to Council Sherrie Simpson, EMS Director Clay Catoe, Procurement Director Nicholas Miller, Architect Chris Steude of Moseley Architects and various EMS staff. A quorum of the Lancaster County Public Safety Committee was present for the meeting.

The following press were notified of the meeting by e-mail in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act: *Lancaster News*, *Kershaw News Era*, *The Rock Hill Herald*, *Fort Mill Times*, Cable News 2, Channel 9 and the local Government Channel. The agenda was posted in the lobby of the County Administration Building and also on the county website for the required length of time.

Call to Order

Committee Chairman Brian Carnes called the meeting to order at approximately 4:02 p.m.

Approval of the Agenda

Billy Mosteller moved to approve the agenda. The motion was seconded by Larry Honeycutt. The Committee approved the agenda by unanimous vote of 3-0.

Citizens Comments

There were no citizens that came forward for comments.

Approval of Minutes

Larry Honeycutt moved to approve the minutes from the October 9, 2018 Public Safety Committee regular meeting. The motion was seconded by Billy Mosteller. The approval of the October 9, 2018 Public Safety Committee regular meeting minutes passed by unanimous vote of 3-0.

Discussion / Action Items

Discussion of EMS Headquarters.

Nicholas Miller provided an update on the EMS Headquarters project. He noted that staff and Council are having “sticker shock” on the estimate for the project, which is over two (2) million dollars. He explained that the building is a large building. Clay Catoe reviewed the schematic drawing for the project. He noted that EMS is now operating out of four (4) separate buildings and that the new Headquarters building would put everyone under one roof. He explained that it is hard to put together the department’s Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC) training calendar because they have to juggle the training dates around according to the space that may be available. The EMS Headquarters would accommodate about one hundred (100) people in the training room. He explained that the last renter that was in the EMS Headquarters building tore up the building. He passed around fourteen (14) pictures of the building in its current state, which are attached as Schedule A. He also noted that EMS is the second largest department in the County, but that they have no true home. The Committee discussed the rent at the 15th Street building. He also explained that their training is subject to DHEC inspection at any time.

Chris Steude of Moseley Architects reviewed the potential design with the Committee. The Committee discussed the potential growth of the EMS Department. Larry Honeycutt asked if something could be done to make the last renters who tore up the building pay for some of the repairs. The Committee and the architect discussed possible ways to cut down costs for the project by using add alternates or phasing the project.

DHEC EMS Grant.

Clay Catoe explained that this grant is an annual grant from DHEC for EMS. He stated that the funds will be used to purchase laptop computers to go in the EMS ambulances. He noted that these computers are required by DHEC. Steve Willis explained that the local match will come from the grant match fund.

Larry Honeycutt moved to send the acceptance of the DHEC EMS Grant and grant match approval to full Council with a favorable recommendation. The motion was seconded by Billy Mosteller. The motion passed by unanimous vote of 3-0.

Steve Willis explained that the 2019 calendar does not have any real changes except the request to add Veteran's Day as an official County holiday.

Adjournment

Billy Mosteller moved to adjourn the Public Safety Committee meeting. The motion was seconded by Larry Honeycutt. The motion to adjourn the Committee meeting passed by unanimous vote of 3-0. There being no further business, the Public Safety Committee meeting adjourned at approximately 4:49 p.m.

Date Requested to be on Agenda: Next Available

Issue for Consideration:

Sheriff Faile would like to request purchase of 41 complete active shooter kits and Tactical helmets:

- 1) Plate Carrier
- 2) 2 Steel Plates
- 3) Tactical Helmets

In addition, Sheriff Faile would like to purchase an AirWorx Police/Fire Package M210, XT2, Z30 Drone, which includes the airframe kit, camera/dual sensor, and batteries.

Package includes delivery, setup and check flight.

Points to Consider:

The purchase of these complete kits will allow us to suit our entire force. This purchase will be for those on staff, who do not currently have an active shooter kit.

The purchase of the drone will benefit with search and rescue efforts, criminal apprehension, surveillance, intelligence Gathering for search warrants. We already have a licensed remote pilot on staff.

Funding and Liability Factors:

- Requesting funding for the equipment referenced above at the following costs:
- Tactical Helmet: with Full Cut / low profile with pads, it is constructed from para aramid material and provides lightweight, robust protection from ballistic and fragmentation projectiles, works with communication equipment, gas masks; Point Blank Active shooter steel plate carrier and 2 steel plates.

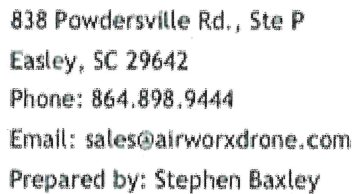
Active Shooter Kits Total: \$23, 431.74 (includes kits, tax and shipping)

- Requesting funding for the drone package.

AirWorx Police/Fire Drone Package: \$24,503.00

Council Options: Sheriff Faile is requesting consideration of funding for the purchase of 41 complete active Shooter kits and the AirWorx Special Package. **Total for consideration based on current quotes is, \$47,934.74.**

Recommendation: Sheriff Faile does not have funding in the budget to purchase the additional active shooter kits Nor the AirWorx drone package and requests funding for both.

Issue for Consideration:

Reallocation of resources in Public Safety Communications.

Points to Consider:

This change does not involve a budget transfer so we can handle this on the staff level. That said, when we hit something like this we want to make sure that Council is kept in the loop. With the upcoming update of our Computer Aided Dispatch software we hit some related computer software that must be updated. This is still a contractual matter and some other planned upgrades will be deferred to allow for this.

The ESRI computer mapping (GIS) component of Computer Aided Dispatch must be updated. We currently operate off of version 9.5; the minimum requirement for the new CAD software is version 10.1; we will be upgrading to the most recent version which is 10.5. The cost is \$54,000.

We must update our VMware and VM sphere licensing to meet the new CAD requirements. This cost is \$17,028.

We must update the servers to handle the new software. This cost is \$2,206.

Funding and Liability Factors:

Individual components discussed above. This will be handled administratively by changing spending priorities and there will be no change to the budget.
