A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LOGAN APPROVING THE PROGRAM YEAR 2019 (PY2019) CONSOLIDATED ANNUAL PERFORMANCE AND EVALUATION REPORT (CAPER) IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ENTITLEMENT COMMUNITY REQUIREMENTS OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HUD) FOR THE RECEIPT OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS.

WHEREAS, Logan City is a municipal corporation, duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Utah;

WHEREAS, the City of Logan was designated as a Metropolitan Statistical Area and an entitlement community relating to the receipt of HUD CDBG funds in May 2003;

WHEREAS, 24 CFR 91.520 requires each entitlement community to complete a CAPER after the close of each program year;

WHEREAS, Logan Municipal Council desires to comply with the applicable requirements of HUD and approve its PY2019 CAPER, notice of which has been duly published and which report has been available for public comment in accordance with the Citizen Participation Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LOGAN MUNICIPAL COUNCIL, that the PY2019 CAPER is hereby adopted by the City of Logan and approved to be submitted to HUD.


This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and approval.





July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020

- 
- ▶ The Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) reviews the progress of the City's 2019 Annual Action Plan (AAP).
 - ▶ Logan City received \$471,651 in CDBG funds for Program Year 2019. The 2019 AAP is the first Annual Action Plan for the Five-Year Consolidated Plan (2019-2023).
 - ▶ The main objectives of the Consolidated Plan and the 2019 AAP are:
 - ▶ Invest in infrastructure projects in neighborhoods with eligible low/moderate income (LMI) areas (40%).
 - ▶ Invest in remediation of access and mobility barriers in all neighborhoods (10%).
 - ▶ Sustain community needs that support LMI residents of Logan (30%).

INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

Approved & Completed during PY2019

- ▶ Three Point Ave & Southwest St. Sidewalk
- ▶ Boulevard-USU Tunnel Trail



Three Point & Southwest St. Sidewalk

Completed Spring 2020

- **2,267' of new 5' wide sidewalk, curb & gutter**
- **4 new ADA ramps**
- **11,335 SF landscaping restoration**
- **9,834 SF of new asphalt**
- **Benefits 6,205 residents, of which 3,440 (55%) are LMI.**
- **Project Cost - \$259,443**



Boulevard-USU Tunnel Trail

Completed Spring 2020

- **8' wide multi-use trail along 800' of 4th North linking 6th East & the Boulevard with the USU tunnel**
- **Benefits 6,950 residents, of which 5,070 (70%) are LMI**
- **Project Cost - \$30,000**

- ▶ Audible Traffic Signals

Completed Spring 2020

- 500' of New Sidewalk
- 500' of New Sidewalk
- Area identified in the Access & Mobility Plan
- Project Cost - \$15,000



Audible Traffic Signals

Completed Spring 2020

Installation of audible traffic signals at two prioritized intersections:

200 North 100 East

1400 N 400 East

- ❖ Persons with a disability account for nearly 10% of Logan's population
- ❖ Project Cost - \$12,000



Community Needs Projects

Approved & Completed PY2019

- ▶ Whittier Center Playground Flooring
- ▶ Family Place Outdoor Lighting/Security Cameras

WHITTIER CENTER PLAYGROUND FLOORING

Completed Spring 2020

- **Replace rubber tile flooring in the “tot area” of the outdoor playground area**
- **Project qualifies as presumed benefit by remediating access and mobility barriers for persons with disabilities and is in a specified geographic area with at least 50% LMI residents**
- **Project Cost - \$40,000**



Family Place Outdoor Lighting & Security Cameras

Completed Spring 2020

- **Installation of three (3) security cameras and outdoor lighting around the outdoor court area**
- **Benefits 1,056 LMI residents**
- **Project Cost - \$17,000**

Completed during 2019

- ▶ Program Administration PY2019 - \$ 83,271
- ▶ Public Arts Master Plan - \$23,000
