RESOLUTION NO. 22-16**

**A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG)
ANNUAL ACTION PLAN (PROGRAM YEAR 2022) FOR THE CITY OF LOGAN.**

WHEREAS, the City of Logan (City) was designated a Metropolitan Statistical Area in May of 2003; and

WHEREAS, the City is required to develop an Annual Action Plan each year for submission for approval to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The plan delineates funding allocations to CDBG sub-recipients, strategic priorities and a community needs assessment; and

WHEREAS, the City will receive \$553,670 to allocate from HUD for PY2022; and

WHEREAS, the City has complied with the applicable requirements approved by HUD and outlined in the City's Five-Year Consolidated Plan, which requires that:

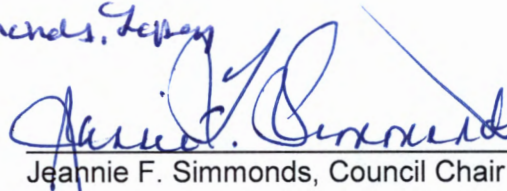
- A steering committee is formed to meet and review each eligible application for funding and to come to a unanimous consensus for a recommendation; which recommendation includes funding allocations and funding conditions; and which is submitted for approval to the collective City Council; and
- Specified public hearings are held, notices are published, and the Annual Action Plan under consideration is made available for public review and comment in accordance with the Citizen Participation Plan.


**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOGAN,
UTAH:**

1. The PY2022 Annual Action Plan, including funding decision, the summary of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, is hereby adopted by the City of Logan and approved to be submitted to HUD.
2. This resolution shall be effective immediately, as of the date of its adoption.

5 YEAR GOALS 2019 – 2023 CON PLAN

Goal #1

Invest in neighborhood Infrastructure - 50%

- 40 % invest in neighborhood infrastructure
- 10% invest in remediation of access & mobility barriers in all neighborhoods

Goal #2

Community needs/public services - 30%

- 20% invest in public facility improvements
- 10% invest in public service improvements (15% annual cap)

Goal #3

Administration & Planning – 20%

- 15% CDBG Administration (20% annual cap)
- 5% Planning

- \$35,000 – 100 E POPLAR AVE PEDESTRIAN CROSSING
- \$120,000 – 900 N 100 W SIDEWALK (REALLOCATED FUNDS)
- \$109,315 – ADA RAMP UPDATES*
- \$133,216.97 – PEDESTRIAN CROSSING BEACONS* (\$73,216.97 FROM REALLOCATED FUNDS)

➤ **COMMUNITY NEEDS/PUBLIC SERVICE PROJECTS**

- \$29,622 – WHITTIER CENTER EXTERIOR PAINT

➤ **CDBG ADMINISTRATION**

- \$110,733 – ADMINISTRATION & PLANNING

*Any PY2022 funds awarded by HUD in excess of the estimate, or any funds recaptured from any other CDBG activity from any program year, will be reallocated to the ADA Ramp Updates project up to a total project funding of \$200,000, and the Pedestrian Crossing Beacons project up to a total project funding of \$200,000.

- \$50,000
- Install 315' of sidewalk, curb & gutter
- Two new ADA-Compliant Pedestrian Ramps.
- 100 South from Main Street to approximately 50 West

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WEST WILLOW PARK SIDEWALKS

- \$42,000
- Install what is left from the ongoing 2017 accessibility improvement project
- Total of 3400' of sidewalk, curb & gutter
- Six ADA-Compliant Pedestrian Ramps

WOODRUFF NEIGHBORHOOD

South on 500 W

East on 800 S

East on 700 S

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300 S 500 E SIDEWALK

- Safe route to school
- \$117,000
- Install 1100' of sidewalk, curb & gutter
- Three new ADA-Compliant Pedestrian Ramps.
- 300 S & 500 E

WILSON NEIGHBORHOOD

North on 500 E

West on 300 S

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100 E POPLAR AVE PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

- \$35,000
- Install 20' of sidewalk
- Two new ADA-Compliant Pedestrian Ramps.
- 2 Pedestrian activated crossing beacons
- Trail connection between Garff Gardens and the Pioneer Park trail to Merlin Olsen Park

WILSON NEIGHBORHOOD



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900 N 100 W SIDEWALK

- Adjacent to Bridger park
- \$120,000
- Install 830' of sidewalk, curb & gutter
- Five ADA-Compliant Pedestrian Ramps
- 900 North and 100 West

BRIDGER NEIGHBORHOOD



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ADA RAMP UPDATES

RECEIVER PROJECT

- \$109,315
- Install/upgrade ADA Ramps on 21 corners (\$5,000 per corner).

ADAMS NEIGHBORHOOD

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PEDESTRIAN CROSSING BEACONS

RECEIVER PROJECT

- \$133,216.97
- Install flashing crossing beacons throughout the city (\$10,000 per corner).
