PC 21-068 Altitude -Requesting continuance to the February 10th meeting [Design Review & Subdivision Permit] Nathan Leishman/Altitude Property LLC, authorized agent/owner, request a design review & subdivision permit to subdivide the first phase of this project into 144, two and three level townhomes with garages on the main level. The overall master plan shows 474 townhomes located on two parcels totaling 24.39 acres at approximately 2012 South 800 West in the Mixed Residential Medium (MR-20) zone: TIN 03-001-0010; -0013. (Woodruff Neighborhood)

PC 21-069 Lloyd Estates -Requesting continuance to the February 10th meeting [Subdivision Permit] Riley Duke/Cache Cal Holdings, authorized agent/owner, request a subdivision permit to subdivide 7.23 acres into 44 single family home building lots located at approximately 200 West 600 North in the Traditional Neighborhood Residential (NR-6) zone; TIN 05-045-0016. (Bridger Neighborhood)

PC 22-002 1600 Park Avenue-Phase 4 Change -Requesting continuance to the February 24th meeting [Design Review Permit] Marty McFadden/River Valley Development, authorized agent/owner, request a design review permit to amend their previously approved phase 4 design by replacing the two proposed buildings on the northwest corner with one building. The project is located at approximately 200 W 1600 N in the Commercial (COM) zone; TIN 04-082-0019. (Bridger Neighborhood)

PC 22-005 Westfield Lofts [Design Review] Tony Johnson/HRT Holdings, LLC, authorized agent/owner, request a design review permit to modify the previously approved commercial design to include 26 residential units on the upper floor. The project is located at 1115 West 130 South in the Commercial (COM) zone; TIN 05-107-1026; -1027; -1028. (Ellis Neighborhood)

PC 22-006 Blue Spring Business Park-Buildings 1 & 2 [Design Review] Andrew Bollschweller/Jason Larsen, authorized agent/owner, request a design review permit to construct two new concrete warehouse buildings, one is 189,739 SF and the other 63,034 SF. The project is located at approximately 1200 North 800 West in the Industrial Park (IP) zone; TIN 05-050-0019. (Bridger Neighborhood)

PC 22-007 Land Development Code Amendment-Short Term Rentals [Code Amendment] Mike DeSimone/Logan City, request an amendment to the Land Development Code to Chapter 17.08 "Neighborhood Residential Uses"; Chapter 17.11 "District and Corridor zone uses"; Chapter 17.37 "Additional Development Standards"; and Chapter 17.62 "Definitions" to include standards for short term rentals in residential and commercial zones.

PC 22-008 Land Development Code Amendment-District & Corridor Use Update and RV Park Standards [Code Amendment] Mike DeSimone/Logan City, request an amendment to the Land Development Code to Chapter 17.11 "District and Corridor zone uses"; Chapter 17.15 "Development Standards: Public Zones"; Chapter 17.37 "Additional Development Standards", to remove RV parks and self-storage warehousing from the commercial services and industrial zones and include minimum development standards for RV parks.

The Logan City Planning Commission is a quasi-judicial body established for purposes of reviewing applications for development as required by the Land Development Code. The Planning Commission is charged to carry out the growth and development policies of the Municipal Council as expressed in the General Plan and to implement the programs of the plan. The Commission functions as the approval body for certain planning and zoning matters, and reviews and recommends on legislative matters related to planning and zoning, in conformance with Utah law.

As a quasi-judicial body, the decisions made by this body pertain only to matters proposed on the published agenda, upon consideration of facts, reports and testimony provided in evidence of a project. The Commission must rely on substantial evidence in determining whether a project complies with the law. Emotional pleas or personal opinions are not substantive evidence.

Meetings are conducted at the discretion of the Commission, and we ask for your cooperation in maintaining the following:

- a) *Consideration of items will occur as indicated on the printed agenda, although the Commission reserves the right to alter the order if the need arises.*
- b) *Those speaking are asked to keep comments relevant to the matter being considered.*
- c) *Outbursts, including cheers, jeers, and applause are not appropriate as they may discourage those with opposing views from speaking.*
- d) *Items involving a large number of people wishing to make comments, a time limit may be imposed.*
- e) *Once the public comment portion for a particular item has been closed, no additional public comments are allowed, unless requested by the Commission.*
- f) *Anyone wishing to speak is asked to sign in at the podium.*
- g) *All public comment and questions will be made into the microphone at the podium to allow for recording of the proceeding.*
- h) *The meeting is managed by the Chair. All questions/comments will be directed to the Commission.*
