

CITY OF LOGAN WORK IN THE RIGHT OF WAY PERMIT APPROVAL CONDITIONS

Each Work in the Right of Way Permit issued by the City of Logan shall be subject to the terms and conditions and policies as stated and/or amended in The Logan Municipal Code, Chapter 12.06; https://codelibrary.amlegal.com/codes/loganut/latest/logan_ut/0-0-0-6372 and Logan City Standards and Specifications.

1. A copy of the issued permit shall be at the construction site whenever any work is in progress. If a copy of the permit is not present, all work at that site will stop until a copy can be supplied. Except as provided for in emergency situations, work commenced in the right of way without an approved will be subject to penalty as stated in Logan Municipal Code, Sections 12.06.160 and/or 12.06.220.
2. Each permit application shall state the starting and estimated completion date. Work shall be completed within five (5) days from the starting date or as determined by the city engineer. Such determination shall be based upon factors reasonably related to the work to be performed under the permit. If work is not completed during such period, prior to the expiration of the permit, the permittee may apply to the city engineer for an additional permit or an extension, which may be granted by the city engineer for good cause shown. The length of the extension requested by the permittee shall be subject to the approval of the city engineer. No extension shall be made that allows work to be completed in the winter period (Logan Municipal Code, Sections 12.06.060).
3. This permit shall apply only to work done within the public right of way and/or public utility easements in front of or around any property boundary. If easements do not exist, the utility company shall obtain easements or permits from the property owners before performing any work.
4. All excavations in other than pavement conditions shall be backfilled and compacted to approximate existing conditions with the surface slightly mounded with excavated or backfill material. All sod, landscaping, sprinklers, etc. shall be restored to original condition.
5. The Contractor shall furnish a permit fee as required on the Work in the Right of Way Permit Application. The Contractor is responsible for asphalt patching of excavations in pavement areas as well as the replacement of any curb & gutter and/or sidewalk removed or damaged during construction. The Contractor is responsible for cleanup at the construction site. This includes removing all extraneous material and/or equipment and sweeping and/or washing of the area.

6. Work shall not deviate from work approved on the permit without approval of the Public Works Department, including location or method of construction.
7. All work shall be in accordance with the City of Logan Standards and Specifications and will be subject to inspection and approval of a Logan City Public Works Inspector and/or correction of work as required by the Inspector. Appointments for inspections to be made 24 hours in advance of the time the inspection is needed by calling the assigned inspector indicated on the issued permit.
8. Traffic control and project safety will be in accordance with City of Logan Standards and Specifications and shall be as shown on the provided Traffic Control Plan or as required by the Inspector according to site specific conditions.
9. The Contractor is required to notify private property owners adjacent to work areas of extents and schedule prior to beginning work. Failure to do so will result in loss of deposit.
10. Logan City Police & Fire Departments (435-753-7555), Cache Valley Transit District (435-752-2877), and School District Transportation (435-792-7640) shall be notified at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of any planned street closure or traffic detour.
11. Any violation of any of the above conditions or other items that are a part of the permit shall result in stopping of work at that site until the violation is corrected. Repeated violations shall result in removing the contractor from the job. Unresolved or repeated violations may also result in stopping of all work by the company until compliance is evident.
12. All boring shall comply with 54-8a-5.5. of the Utah State Code including potholing of all crossing utilities to locate their precise location. Bore logs are to be provided to the Public Works Inspector.

NOTE: Permit applications for Work in the Right of Way after November 15th, specifically permits involving excavation in existing asphalt and/or concrete surfacing, shall be allowed only if the work is an emergency or otherwise approved by the Public Works Director.
