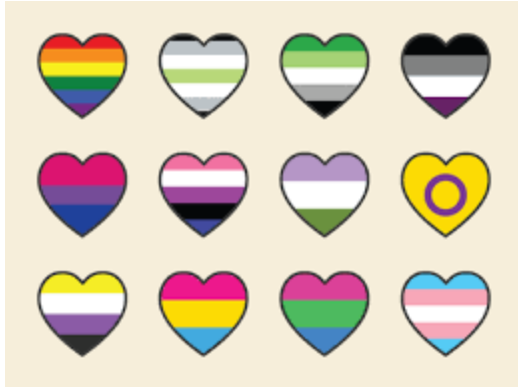

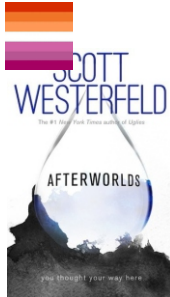

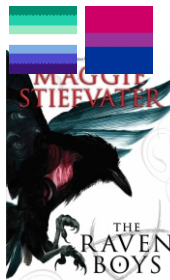
Carry on

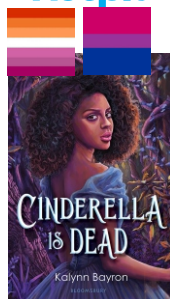
Afterworlds

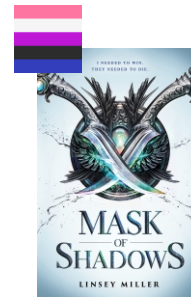
Cinderella is dead

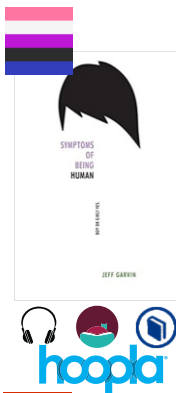
The Prince and the Dressmaker

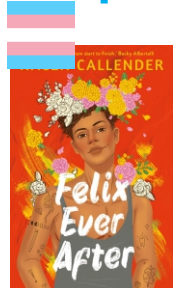
Girl made of stars by Ashley Herring Blake TEEN FICTION BLAKE

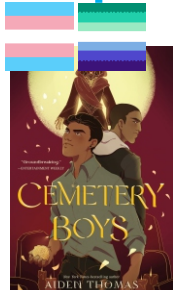

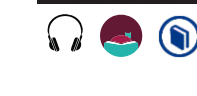

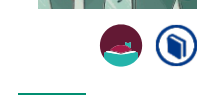
Autoboyography by Christina Lauren TEEN FICTION LAUREN
