Meeting Minutes April 16, 2015

CALL TO ORDER 6:00pm

ROLL CALL

DETERMINATION OF QUORUM

Chairman Aveni determined quorum is present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

DEPUTY CHIEF HOUSE MOVED to approve the minutes of the March 19, 2015 meeting; President Lesnik seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote: AYES – Deputy Chief House, President Lesnik, Chief Bowman, Director Burns, Chief DeRamus, and Assistant Chief Orndoff. **MOTION CARRIED (6/0)**

CHAIPERSON'S REPORT

Chairman Aveni welcomed everyone to the meeting. He stated that the tax rate, not to exceed, has been set and that the public hearings on the budget are scheduled for April 27th

MANASSAS FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT'S REPORT

Chief Bowman reported that today, April 16th, marks the eighth anniversary of the line of duty death of Kyle Wilson. He stated that it is his hope "that today, and every day, people remember this tragedy and take steps necessary to avoid another tragedy." The annual memorial walk will be held this Saturday; all funds raised go to a memorial scholarship in Kyle's name.

Deputy US Fire Administrator Glenn Gaines passed away while at his home this past weekend. He was a very well respected member of the national fire service. Before joining the USFA he began his career in Fairfax County where he progressed through the ranks to Chief of the Department. His viewing was today and the funeral is tomorrow.

Chief Bowman reported that Mike Moon (Public Works and Utilities Director) has retired from the City. The City Manager has decided to restructure Public Works and Utilities into two separate departments. Additionally, Jim Tanner, PWCDFR, retired April 1st after 40 years of service with PWC.

The five new MFRD members complete their orientation class tomorrow and will begin their assignments Monday. A few members of the existing staff were given transfers as well. This information will be shared with leadership.

Last month, the System responded to 342 calls for service within the City, with 632 unit responses. Additionally, members responded to 153 calls for service within PWC and MP with 232 unit responses.

A new CERT class has begun; they will complete their training next Saturday. Several staff members attended the Emergency Management Institute at the National Fire Academy for a week long course on Situational Awareness Common Operating Picture.

APPARATUS MAINTENANCE – March 2015

Maintenance costs for the month were \$4,945.97, and YTD \$146,067.53.

MANASSAS VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY'S REPORT

President Lesnik gave an update on the construction at the firehouse. The bunk room is being completed this week, carpeting is going in, and painting is almost done. He recently received space information concerning lockers; he will discuss with Chief Bowman and Deputy Chief House. The June FRC meeting will be hosted at the fire station so a tour can be conducted; the majority of the renovation will be done by then.

Chief DeRamus stated that MVFC has brought on five new members; they are on a 30 day trial because of the background investigations that need to be done. They came from other areas so most of their training is already complete. Once the background checks come back, they will be presented to the Board of Directors for a probationary one year term. Chief DeRamus stated that the last week of April will be a busy time and require all hands on deck. There are meetings, the air show, museum exhibit opening, and the volunteer recognition ceremony, in addition to answering calls for service.

GREATER MANASSAS VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD'S REPORT

Assistant Chief Orndoff reported that GMVRS provided 502 hours of service in March 2015. Of that, 416.5 hours were staffing units, including when more than one unit was staffed by GMVRS members. GMVRS staffed their shifts 81% of the time. Members spent 137.75 hours in training, which is an increase from 88.25 hours in February. Additionally, crews answered 103 calls for service.

There are three new trial members; several new members are still awaiting the results from the VAOEMS background checks. Director Burns noted that there is a 1 to 2 month delay. Chief DeRamus noted that the VAOEMS has made a new ruling that Boards can vote to accept new members without the background check results, however, they must have a procedure in place to dismiss them, if necessary, if the background checks come back with negative results.

Assistant Chief Orndoff stated that GMVRS held its first UTV/ATV rescue awareness and operations class this past weekend; she thanked Chief Bowman and Deputy Chief House for the use of the UTV during this class. Eleven students participated in their first monthly training class; all System members are invited to participate in these monthly training drills. The next class will be April 18th and is on fireground rehab. The monthly orientation weekend classes will now be held on weekday evenings. All training information can be found on their website.

Assistant Chief Orndoff reminded everyone of the "Protecting Manassas" museum exhibit opening. Major repairs were made to Creamy so that unit could be displayed during the exhibit. She thanked Convenience Car Care and Scotties Towing for their assistance during the repairs.

The GMVRS annual open house will be May 16th, 11am – 3pm. This year's event will be larger than in the past. The Sheriff's department will be on hand, as well as several educational vendors. Councilman Aveni asked Assistant Chief Orndoff to work with Patty Prince to advertise the event.

GMVRS is currently selling t-shirts to raise funds for their upcoming 50th anniversary celebration in 2016. Other fundraisers will be coming soon. For t-shirts, please contact Assistant Chief Orndoff or Director Burns.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

(1) Standing Committees

(d) Quality Assurance

Battalion Chief Lupton was responding to a working fire in PWC and could not attend the meeting. The Quality Assurance report was distributed.

ASSISTANT CHIEF ORNDOFF MOVED to replace Kim Krulikowski with Thomas Boyden on the Quality Assurance Committee; Director Burns seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote: AYES – Assistant Chief Orndoff, Director Burns, Chief Bowman, Chief DeRamus, Deputy Chief House and President Lesnik. **MOTION CARRIED (6/0)**

ImageTrend reports from MVFC are still not being received when fire apparatus goes on EMS calls; Chief DeRamus is working with BC Lupton on this. MVFC has consolidated their EMS license with MFRD; because of this change, MVFC no longer has to do separate EMS reports if on the same EMS call as MFRD units. The MVFC Board of Directors agreed unanimously to consolidate their EMS license with MFRD. Assistant Chief Orndoff stated she believed that if a unit goes on a call, an ImageTrend report must be done regardless of who holds the EMS license; Chief DeRamus disagreed.

(f) Strategic Plan

A question was raised as to why the signature lines changed from only the Chiefs, to each representative; Chief Bowman replied that this change to include the whole committee showed more ownership of the plan. The majority opinion was to make this change.

PRESIDENT LESNIK MOVED to adopt the FY15-FY19 strategic plan as presented; Deputy Chief House seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote: AYES – President Lesnik, Deputy Chief House, Chief Bowman, Chief DeRamus, and Assistant Chief Orndoff. **MOTION CARRIED (5/0)** Director Burns abstained from the vote.

(2) NIMS Quarterly Report

Chief Bowman stated that Robb Hoffower report to him that there has been no change since the last report.

(3) GMVRS Insurance Update

Director Burns stated that GMVRS is at an impasse on getting insurance on their own. He passed out a letter from the Board of Directors written to Mayor Parrish and Councilman Aveni regarding the situation. It summarizes what they've done to accomplish the goal. He further

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stated that the City put GMVRS in the position that they're in, and now they are looking to the City for assistance to satisfy the requirement.

President Lesnik stated that MVFC has already entrusted the City to provide insurance; he is going to send some information to Director Burns regarding questions they had and the answers they received. Chief DeRamus stated that he has delegated, in writing, that his Battalion Chiefs can delegate his authority as necessary to commandeer vehicles. It was further stated that if the Board is sued solely, it is not covered; President Lesnik and Director Burns disagreed on the level of risk that could be.

(4) Sub-Committee Membership Updates

This item was covered in the Quality Assurance report.

NEW BUSINESS

(5) SOPs 2.14a and b – Citizen and Student Ride Along Revisions

The proposed changes were discussed including the requirement in both for a background check; it was stated that it was illogical to ask citizens to do this and students already have a background check. Neighboring jurisdictions were asked about their policy and no one else had this requirement. There was also the addition of a form entitled "informed consent."

ACTION: ASSISTANT CHIEF ORNDOFF moved to approve SOPs 2.14 a and b, Citizen and Student Ride Alongs, as revised; Chief DeRamus seconded the motion.

Roll Call Vote: AYES – Assistant Chief Orndoff, Chief DeRamus, Chief Bowman, Director Burns, Deputy Chief House, and President Lesnik. **MOTION CARRIED (6/0)**

Chairman Aveni noted that a specification work group will need to be appointed.

CLOSING COMMENTS

Assistant Chief Orndoff stated that as of today, Chief Huntington has been cleared to run calls. Councilman Aveni instructed Melissa Heiderman to leave the topic of the GMVRS Insurance on the agenda for May.

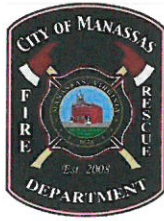
