To: 2022 Election Candidates and Campaigns

Re: Placement of Election Signs on Public Property and Streets

Date: June 1, 2022

Please be advised that, while campaign signs are permitted on private property without permits and up to a size limit of sixteen square feet (residential property), the placement of campaign signs on public property and on public streets is prohibited. Please share these rules with your campaign staff and volunteers:

- Campaign signs cannot be placed on public property, except near polling places as may be authorized by state law. This includes City facilities such as City Hall, the Fire Station and Police Department, Manassas City Public Schools, City parks, the museum system, City-owned parking lots, the Harris Pavilion, and the Manassas Regional Airport.
- Campaign signs cannot be placed in the public street right-of way including the medians and any trees or utility poles.

Signs placed on public property or in the street will be removed and City staff will contact the candidate or campaign to return the signs.
