Osborn Art Graces The Hall



City of Manassas, VA . . . On Monday, April 27, 2015, the Osborn High School art exhibit opened at The Hall at City Hall. These incredibly talented high school students painted, sculpted and created amazing pieces of art that are on display at City Hall through May 22. These young artists not only created the artwork, but helped to hang the displays, created text under each image and learned a great deal about what goes on behind the scenes when opening an art exhibit.

Mayor Parrish opened the exhibit, saying “These are outstanding works of art and I’m glad our students could share them with the community by displaying them at City Hall.”

This is the twelfth year that Osborn High School students have been displaying art in City Hall. Mallory, a senior at Osborn, created “Everlasting,” a portrait depicting a girl in her father’s clothing. In her synopsis underneath the painting, she writes, “This piece specifically depicts

my close mentor and friend wearing the shirt of her father figure who was killed in action. He remains with her even today, leaving an ‘everlasting’ effect on her.”

Samantha, another Osborn student, won third place in the Off the Wall art competition at the Candy Factory Center for the Arts with her piece, “Seventh Circle of Daisies.” These are just two of the artists featured in this exhibit at City Hall. The exhibit is free and open to the public from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.
