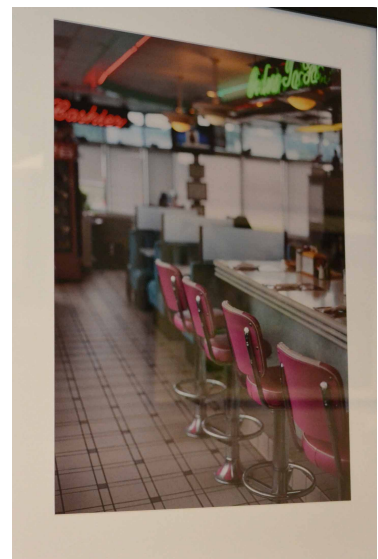

Every individual has a talent that can be expressed and processed differently. In the eyes of an artist, it can be perceived with a whole new definition, dimension, and a potential new discovery.

Donna Bellows, who works in Community Development for the City of Manassas, started with a “Kodak 110” camera. She has worked her way into the digital age. Donna’s passion is candid shots and events, like the Civil War weekend and the Manassas Neighborhood Conference, and events for the Manassas Boys

and Girls Club.

Elena Stewart of Jasmine Jae Photography started taking pictures 17 years ago, when her oldest was an infant, in hopes of capturing every memorable moment.
