

MANASSAS & ROSE HILL CEMETERIES

Guidelines for Families and Visitors

The Manassas and Rose Hill Cemeteries are places of solitude devoted to honoring the dead. Although visitation is permitted, the cemeteries are not public parks and have special rules that preserve their peaceful nature.



The cemeteries are open from dawn to dusk. Vehicles and bicycles must remain on paved paths and drive slowly and carefully. Firearms are prohibited.



Please speak quietly and use headphones if you are listening to something. Please stay on the paths.



Please leave your pets at home. Only service dogs are permitted.



When flowers, wreaths, and emblems placed on graves become faded and unsightly, they will be removed. All other decorations placed on graves will be removed.



No plantings are permitted in the cemeteries without permission from the Director of Public Works.



City landscapers may remove or trim trees or bushes that become dangerous or block pathways.



Lots may not be enclosed by fences, railings or hedges. No corner posts or markers other than those furnished by the city are permitted.



Please be respectful. Do not damage or sit on monuments, gravestones, plants or other property. They are part of these important sites.
