

DIVISION 11. SENIOR CITIZENS CENTER COMMISSION

Code 1976, § 2.29

Sec. 2-341. Established.

The senior citizens center commission is hereby established.

Sec. 2-342. Composition; terms; qualifications.

The senior citizens center commission shall be composed of seven members. The term of any member shall be three years. Members of the commission shall be appointed with due regard to their fitness for the efficient dispatch of the functions, powers and duties vested in and imposed upon the commission. The council shall appoint all members to such commission. Two members shall be appointed from the Marshall Area Senior Citizens, Inc., one member shall be appointed from the city council, and four members shall be appointed from the citizens of the city.

Sec. 2-343. Function.

The function of the senior citizens center commission shall be to manage, operate and maintain the city's senior citizens center.

Sec. 2-344. Powers and duties.

The powers and duties of the senior citizens center commission shall be as follows:

- (1) Develop and present to the city council their report with recommendation on the city's senior citizens center budget.
- (2) Appoint members of their commission to serve on other commissions of the city.
- (3) Adopt all necessary rules and regulations for their own guidance and for the proper management and operation of such senior citizens center.
- (4) Make on or before December 31, of each year, annual report to the council regarding the operation of the senior citizens center, and how the funds of the city were spent during such year.
- (5) The senior citizens center commission shall have the authority to enter into contracts only after they have been approved by the city council.
- (6) The commission shall have the authority to employ such persons as are necessary to carry out their function, within their budgetary limitations.
