All of Lyon Street from the right of way of the Great Northern Railroad Company to East First Street; all of Sixth Street from Kendall Street to Redwood River; all of Third Street commencing at Lyon Street and running to a point directly opposite the alley which runs North and South through the center of Block Two of Liberty Park Addition; all that part of Fifth Street from Lyon Street to right of way of Chicago & North Western Railroad Company, which improvement for purposes of convenience is hereinafter in this resolution referred to and designated as Improvement B;

That said certificates issued on account of Improvement B shall be two hundred forty-three in number and numbered consecutively from one to two hundred forty-three (243), both inclusive, shall be of the denomination of one thousand dollars (\$1000) each, and shall mature serially twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000.) on July 1st, 1922, and twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000) on July 1st in each of the years 1923 to 1930, both inclusive.

4. That said certificates issued on account of Improvement C shall be ten (10) in number and numbered consecutively from one to ten (10), both inclusive, shall be of the denomination of four hundred dollars (\$400.) each, and shall mature serially eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) on July 1st, 1922, and four hundred dollars (\$400.00) on July 1st in each of the years 1923 to 1930, both inclusive.
