Monday Jan. 16th, 1933.

A regular meeting of the Common Council was held in the City Hall Monday Evening Jan. 16th, 1933, at 7-30 PM. Members present; Blair--Durrenberger--Bladholm, Mayor Middleton. Minutes of last two meetings read and approved.

Durrenberger moved seconded by Bladholm that the low bid of the Daily Messenger of \$28.00 for printing sixty books of statement blanks in duplicate 100 statements to the book be accepted. All voted aye.

Bladholm moved seconded by Durrenberger that the Obrecht Stock Co. be granted a license for the week of Aug. 14th, 1933. All voted aye.

Bladholm moved seconded by Durrenberger that the bills be allowed. All voted aye.

Bladholm moved seconded by Durrenberger that we adopt Resolution No. 316 which reads as follows:

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of Marshall, That whereas the services of the Superintendent of the Marshall Municipal Plant H. F. Eddy has proven unsatisfactory.

Be it resolved that we herewith cancel and terminate the contract entered into between the City of Marshall and the said H. F. Eddy, and discharge him forthwith from our service,

Be it further resolved that we pay him the salary due him for the month of January 1933.

Be it further resolved that we notify said H. F. Eddy of this action at once.

Voting aye Durrenberger--Blair--Bladholm,
Voting No-- None

Motion declared adopted and carried.

Durrenberger moved seconded by Bladholm that Geo. Wombill be employed as Superintendent of the Plant for a period of one year at a salary of \$200.00 per month payable by-monthly, and that we instruct our City Attorney to draw up such contract, and that the Mayor and City Recorder be instructed to sign same for the City of Marshall. All voted aye.

Durrenberger moved seconded by Bladholm that the Chairman appoint a committee of three to go to Granite Falls and investigate the scrip plan now in operation there. All voted aye.

The Chairman appointed the following on this committee Durrenberger, Blair & Harmon.

Durrenberger moved seconded by Bladholm, that Chairman Blair, and the City Attorney from the Council and Messers Simons, and Rose from the Insurance Agents make a division of the insurance on the plant which expires Jan. 22, 1933. All voted aye.

Durrenberger moved seconded by Bladholm that the heat rates be reduced from 90¢ per 1000# of steam to 70¢ per 1000# these rates to become effective Jan. 15th, 1933. All voted aye.

A special meeting of the Common Council was called by the Mayor for the purpose of considering a resolution, to the State Legislature recommending a bill that has been introduced, granting the right of Municipalities to own and operate their own electric lines out side of their corporate limits. Members present--Durrenberger--Healy--Bladholm, Mayor Middleton, and Attorney DeRen.

Durrenberger moved seconded by Bladholm the adoption of Resolution No. 317 which reads as follows:

Be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of Marshall, as follows:

That whereas there has been introduced in the Legislature of the State of Minnesota a bill granting the right to Municipalities to own and possess and operate electric light and power lines out-side their corporate limits, and distribute their products to purchasers residing outside the corporate limits and,

Whereas the City of Marshall owns its own municipal light and power plant and is very much interested in the said bill and in extending its electric light and power lines outside its corporate limits to supply its customers residing in and near Marshall, and in surrounding towns, villages and cities and,

Whereas the said City of Marshall is equipped and organized to handle sell and distribute its said light and Power products to such surrounding villages and cities and needs to extend its lines in order to operate its said plant at a greater profit,

Be it Resolved that we respectfully ask our Senator and Representative to vote, support and work for the passage of the said bill and that we ask the Governor of the State of Minnesota to approve such bill when passed and that we ask all the Senators and representatives in the Legislature of the State of Minnesota to vote in support of such bill.

Be it further resolved that we send a copy of this resolution to our Senator, Representative and Governor and to the speaker of the House and to the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Minnesota to be read into their records.

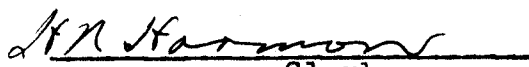

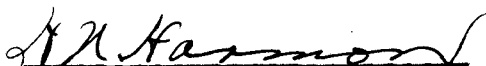

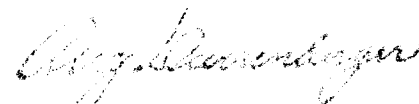
