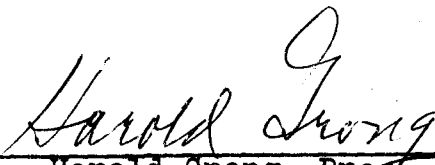

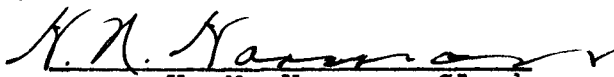
A special meeting of the Council was held on Feb. 11, 1950, at 11:30 AM. Members present: Grong, Asp, Bussard, and Neisen.

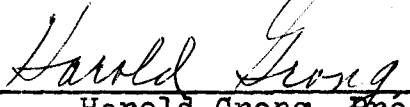

Resolution No. 531, was duly adopted approving the grade on Highway No. 23, from the South City limits to Trunk Highway No. 19.

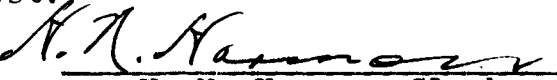

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE
ISSUANCE AND SALE OF \$16,000 MUNICIPAL
AIRPORT REVENUE CERTIFICATES AND PRESCRIBING
THE TERMS AND PROVISIONS FOR REPAYMENT.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Marshall, Minnesota, as follows:

1. In order to provide money for the construction of hangars and other improvements at the Municipal airport, there shall be issued and sold Municipal Airport Revenue Certificates of the city in the aggregate principal amount of \$16,000, said certificates to be 16 in number and numbered from 1 to 16, both inclusive, and in the denomination of \$1,000 each, all bearing date October 1, 1950, bearing interest at the rate of four per cent per annum, payable semiannually on the 1st day of April and the 1st day of October in each year and maturing serially on October 1st in the years and amounts as follows: \$1,000 in 1953 to 1958, both inclusive, and \$2,000 in 1959 to 1963, both inclusive, all certificates maturing after October 1, 1955, to be subject to redemption on said date and any interest payment date thereafter at par and accrued interest.

2. The said certificates shall be payable solely from the net income and revenues to be received by the city from the airport properties, more specifically described as all of the Southeast Quarter of Section 6 and the West Half of the West Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 5, both in Township 111, Range 41, after payment of all necessary expenses of current operations, including purchase of stock. Included in the net revenues shall be all rentals received from the housing project constructed thereon and any other net profits or income from sales of services at said Airport.

3. The certificates and the coupons to be thereto attached shall be in substantially the following form:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That the City of Marshall, Lyon County, Minnesota, certifies that it is obligated to pay to bearer out of the Municipal Airport Revenue Certificate Fund the principal sum of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS on the 1st day of October, 19 , and to pay interest thereon from the date hereof until the principal sum is paid at the rate of four percent (4%) per annum, interest to maturity to be payable semiannually on the 1st day of April and the 1st day of October in each year in accordance with and upon presentation and surrender of the interest coupons hereto attached as they severally become due. Both principal and interest are payable at the main office of the First National Bank of Minneapolis in the City of Minneapolis, Minnesota, in any coin or currency of the United States of America which at the time of payment is legal tender for public and private debts.

All certificates of this issue which mature after October 1, 1955 are subject to redemption at the option of the city at par and accrued interest on said date and any interest payment date thereafter upon thirty days prior notice by mail to the bank where the certificates are payable and to the last known holder. Holders desiring to receive such notice must register their names, addresses and certificate numbers with the city recorder.

This certificate is one of an issue in the aggregate principal amount of \$16,000, all of like date and tenor except as to maturity, all issued for the purpose of providing money for the construction, furnishing and equipping of hangars at the municipal airport and is payable solely from net revenues of the municipal airport as defined and provided in the authorizing resolution and the common council of the city shall not be required to levy taxes or collect or use any moneys received from taxation for the payment of either principal hereof or interest hereon.

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED AND RECITED That in and by the authorizing resolution the common council has covenanted and agreed that it will continue to operate the municipal airport in order to provide net revenues therefrom and will use the same for the

payment of principal hereof and interest hereon, that it will carry adequate insurance on the airport buildings and contents, that it will keep suitable books of record and account to show all transactions in connection with the municipal airport, that it has established and will maintain a Municipal Airport Revenue Certificate Fund into which shall be paid, out of net revenues of the Municipal Airport, amounts sufficient to pay principal of and interest on all certificates of this issue when due.

IT IS FURTHER CERTIFIED AND RECITED That all acts, conditions and things required under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Minnesota to be done, to exist, to happen and to be performed precedent to and in order to make this certificate a valid and binding obligation according to its terms have been done, do exist, have happened and have been performed and that this certificate does not create an indebtedness of the city contrary to any constitutional or statutory limitation of indebtedness.

4. The certificates shall be prepared under the direction of the city recorder and shall be executed on behalf of the city by the signature of the mayor and attested by the city recorder with the corporate seal of the city affixed and the interest coupons shall be executed and authenticated by the printed, engraved or lithographed facsimile signatures of said officers. When so executed the certificates shall be delivered by the treasurer to the purchaser as hereinafter provided upon receipt of the purchase price, which shall be paid into the Municipal Airport Revenue Certificate Fund, and the purchaser shall not be required to see the the proper application thereof.

5. The certificates shall be payable at the main office of First National Bank of Minneapolis in the City of Minneapolis, Minnesota, and the city shall pay the reasonable charges of such paying agent as an expense of airport operation.

6. The city shall maintain a Municipal Airport Revenue Certificate Fund to which shall be credited all income and rentals from the municipal airport as herein provided and the proceeds from the sale of the certificates. Said fund shall be divided into four separate accounts as follows:

(a) A Capital Expenditure Account to which shall be credited the proceeds from the sale of the certificates and any other amounts heretofore or hereafter appropriated for the construction of hangars as herein provided. There shall be charged against said account said account all expenditures for the construction and equipment of the said hangars. Any amount therein after the hangars have been constructed and equipped shall be credited to the Interest and Sinking Account

(b) An Operations Account to which shall be credited all income and revenues of the airport, including revenues from rentals and services and sales of gasoling and oils. Out of the account shall be paid all normal and ordinary costs of current operation and maintenance, including payment for necessary labor and materials and the purchase at Wholesale of aviation gasoline and oil. There shall be retained in said account a sufficient amount to pay one month's operating expense. The balance shall be deemed net income and shall be transferred as herein provided.

(c) An Interest and Sinking Account to which shall be credited from the net income as herein provided the amount required to pay principal and interest to become due on the outstanding certificates during the ensuing six months. Such amount shall be deposited with the paying agent.

(d) A Reserve Account to which shall be credited the balance of the net income until there shall be credited thereto an amount equal to the sum of principal and interest due during any year, and which shall be used solely to assure apayment of such principal and interest on the said certificates in event of any deficiency in the Interest and Sinking Account. The amount thereof shall be deposited in a Special Account in a Marshall bank.

(7. Until payment of all certificates issued hereunder the common council shall not issue any obligations payable from net revenues of the municipal airport except that the council shall be authorized to issue additional obligations payable from said net revenues and which may share on a parity in said net revenues provided there shall have been no previous default hereunder and the net revenues from the municipal airport during the preceding three years shall have been in an amount at least one and one-quarter times the largest amount required to meet annual principal and interest requirements on all certificates issued hereunder and such additional certificates.

8. For the protection of the security of the certificates herein authorized the common council covenants and agrees to and with the holders thereof as follows:

(a) So long as permitted by law the city will continue to operate the municipal airport and will charge for gasoline and oil sold thereat prices comparable to other similar airports and will charge rentals for all hagers, buildings and housing projects thereon sufficient to produce net profits from the operation sufficient to pay principal and interest when due. In event that the operations of the airport shall be discontinued, the common council will use its best efforts to rent the property or so much thereof as it is able to rent, in order to provide income and revenues sufficient to pay such principal and interest when due.

(b) All income and revenues from the operations of the municipal iairport will be credited to the proper fund and accoounts and adequate books of record and account will be kept in which true and correct entries will be made of all transactions of receipt and disbursement thereof, which books shall be open to inspection and copying at all reasonable times and said books will be audited at least annually by a certified public accountant and the city will furnish copies of the audit report to all certificate holders upon request.

(c) It will procure and keep in force insurance upon the airport buildings and structures and the contents thereof against loss by fire, windstorm, flood and other causes customarily insured against and suitable fidelity bonds upon all employees charged with the management of the airport or with the custody of the funds in such amounts as may be required to protect the city and all certificate holders against loss by reason of any such casualty or default.

9. In event there shall be an insufficient amount in the Interest and Sinking Account and Reserve Account to pay principal and interest on any certificate when due, the interest on all certificates shall be first paid pro rata and the balance shall be used to pay matured certificates in the order of serial numbers, provided that the city may by agreement with the holder of any maturing certificate refund the same so as to extend the maturity thereof to one year beyond the last maturity of any outstanding certificate and said refunding certificate shall share on a parity as to interest.

10. The nonpayment of any certificate shall constitute a default hereunder and the holders of twenty percent or more in principal amount of the outstanding certificates shall be authorized to bring any action in law or in equity which they may deem suitable on behalf of all certificate holders and may agree to a refunding of outstanding certificates which shall be binding upon all certificate holders.

COUPON BONDS IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT
OF NOT TO EXCEED \$350,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PRO-
VIDING MONEY FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF CITY STREETS?

4. The said election shall be conducted at the regular polling places at the same time and place as the annual city election.

5. Notice of election shall be given by publication in the official newspaper at least once not less than one week prior to the date of said election and by posting in three public places in each ward not less than ten days prior to the date of said election.

6. The City Recorder is authorized and directed to cause said notice to be published and posted and to prepare suitable ballots for the use of the voters at said election. The ballot shall contain the proposition substantially as herein set forth and a sample ballot shall be posted and published with the notice of election.

7. All of the provisions of the Statutes of the State of Minnesota relating thereto shall govern said election and the Common Council shall meet within three days after the date of said election for the purpose of canvassing the same and determining the results thereof.

Bussard, alderman second ward for a term of two years; Marvin F. Ramige, alderman third ward for a term of two years; H. O. Gregoire, City Treasurer for a term of one year; D. S. Kellen, City Clerk for a term of one year. All voted aye.

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a special meeting of the Common Council of the City of Marshall, Minnesota, was duly held at the Council Room in said city on Thursday, the 5th day of April, 1956, at 9:00 o'clock A.M.

The Mayor and the following Aldermen were present: O. T. Bussard, Bruce Pierard, Harry Knieff, and Glenn Olson. and the following were absent: Sam Pomrantz & Marvin F. Ramige.

The Mayor announced that the meeting was convened for the purpose of considering the results of the special election held in and for the city on April 3, 1956, on the question of issuing bonds of the city for the purpose of providing money for improvement of city streets, in the amount of \$350,000. The City Recorder presented affidavits showing publication and posting of notice of election in three public places in each ward of the city, which affidavits were examined and found satisfactory and ordered placed on file. The City Recorder then presented the official returns of the election officials showing the vote on the following question:
