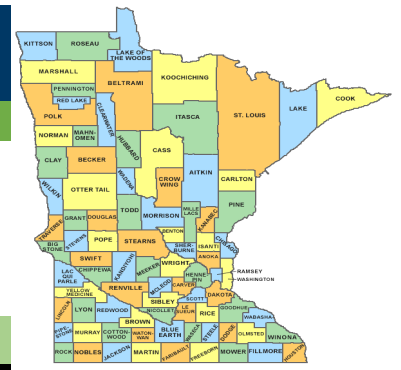


COUNTY PROFILE

Lyon Co.

Lyon Co. is a part of Economic Development Region 8, which is located in the Southwest Planning Region.



POPULATION CHARACTERISTICS

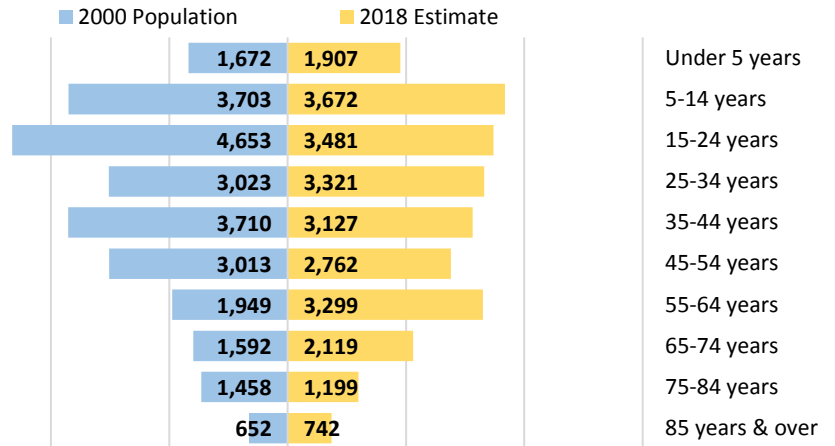
Lyon Co.'s population has decreased so far this decade, ranking as the 52nd fastest growing of the 87 counties in the state from 2010 to 2018. It is now the 40th largest in the state. Lyon Co.'s population has a younger median age than the state and a larger percentage of people aged 65 years and older. The population is aging, especially as the Baby Boom generation moves through the population pyramid (see Figure 1).

Lyon Co. enjoyed a natural increase - more births than deaths from 2010 to 2018, but also experienced net out-migration - meaning more people moved out than moved in. Despite suffering domestic out-migration, Lyon Co. welcomed net international in-migration - gaining new Minnesotans from foreign countries (see Table 2).

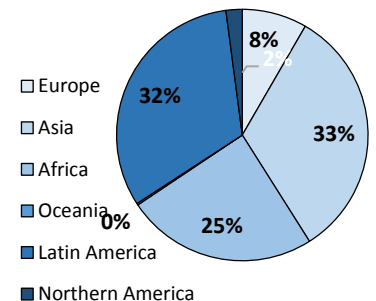

- Two or More Races

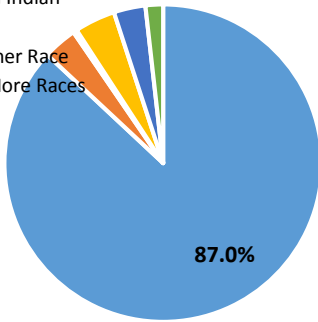

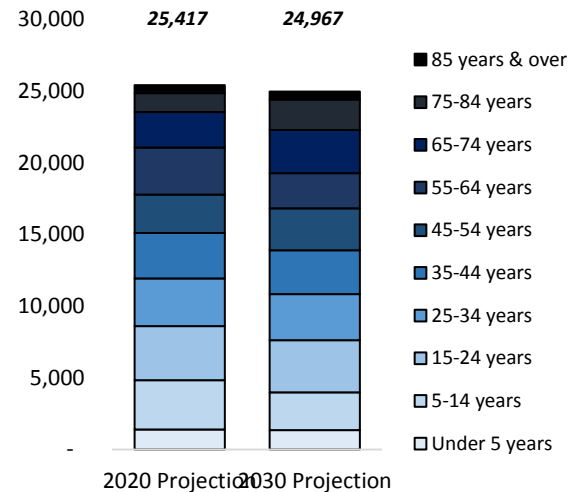
POPULATION PROJECTIONS

According to the Minnesota State Demographic Center, Lyon Co.'s population is expected to decline from 2020 to 2030, with a rate of change that is slower than the projected statewide growth rate (5.0%). Despite the decline, the number of people aged 65 years and older is expected to increase over the next decade (see Figure 4 and Table 5).

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Lyon Co. has a lower percentage of adults (18 years & over) with at least a high school diploma than the state (92.4%), and a lower percentage of people with at least some college experience. Lyon Co. also has a higher percentage of people with an Associate's degree and a lower percentage of people with a Bachelor's degree or higher.

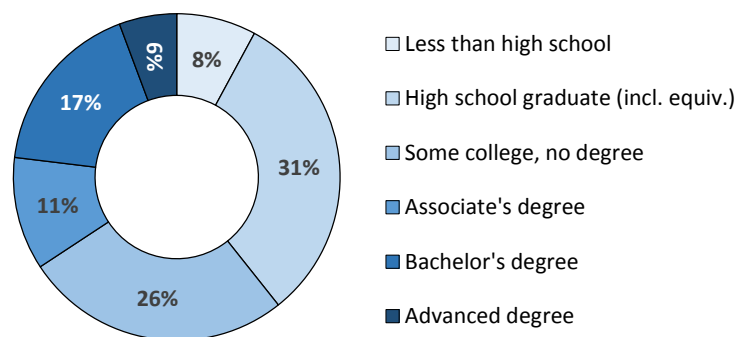

Figure 5. Educational Attainment, 2018



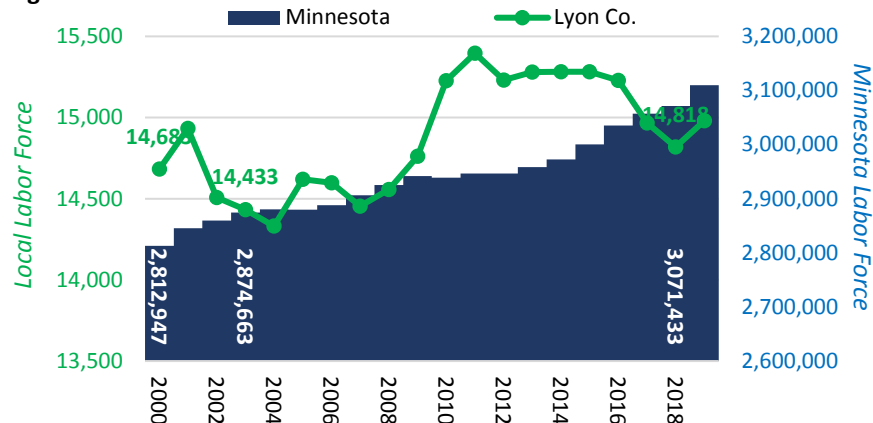

LABOR FORCE TRENDS

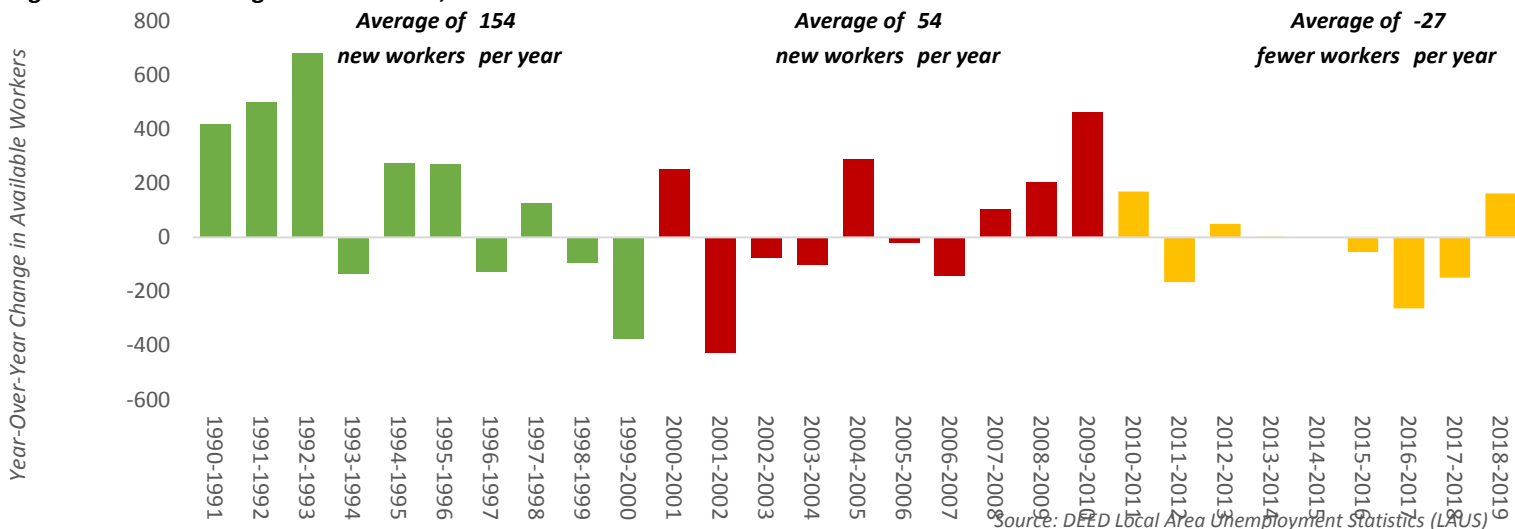
Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates

The number of workers in Lyon Co. increased over the past year. Long term, Lyon Co.'s labor force expanded more slowly from 2004 to 2019, compared to a statewide growth rate of 8.0% (see Figure 6).

At 3.2%, Lyon Co. had a equal to unemployment rate than the state in 2019. Lyon Co.'s unemployment rate increased compared to 2.9% in 2018, and was lower than the 5.8% rate posted in 2009. The number of unemployed workers actively seeking work in Lyon Co. increased over the past year, and is down compared to 2009.

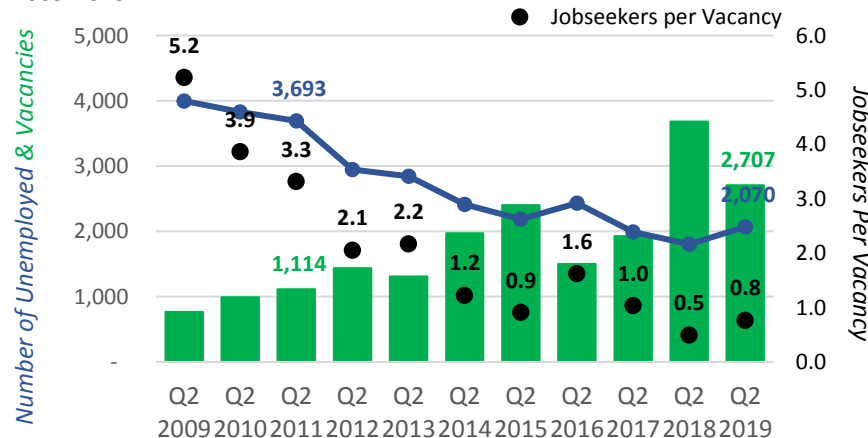
Labor force growth has slowed in recent years. After experiencing a net gain of workers from 1990 to 2000, Lyon Co. averaged an annual gain of new workers from 2000 to 2010, and most recently a loss of fewer workers since 2010 (see Figure 7). Moving forward, Lyon Co. is expected to see a labor force decline from 2020 to 2030 (see Table 6).

Lyon Co. is a part of Region 8, which includes Cottonwood, Jackson, Lincoln, Lyon, Murray, Nobles, Pipestone, Redwood, and Rock County. The labor market has grown extremely tight in recent years, dropping to a ratio of 0.8 jobseekers per vacancy during the 2nd quarter of 2019 (see Figure 8).

LABOR FORCE CHARACTERISTICS

Lyon Co. had a higher labor force participation rate than the state. The labor force in Lyon Co. is less racially diverse than the state (where 85.5% of workers are white alone), but is becoming more diverse over time.

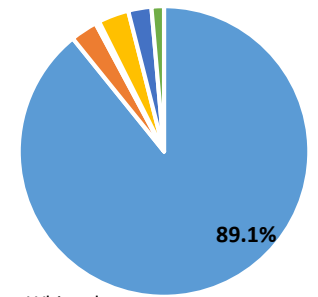

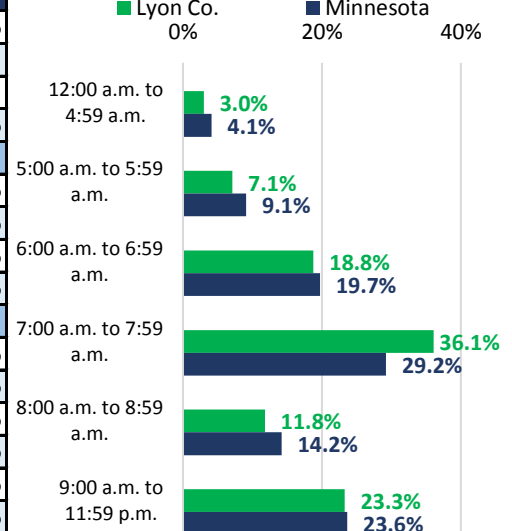

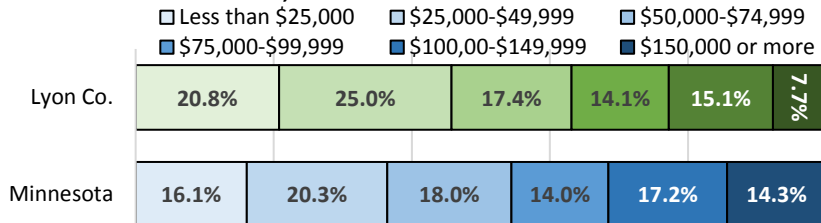
INCOMES, COST OF LIVING, & HOUSING

Lyon Co. also had a lower cost of living than the state, with a required hourly wage of \$12.05 for a single person living alone to meet a basic needs cost of living, and an hourly wage requirement of \$13.77 for a typical family with 2 adults and 1 child (see Table 9).

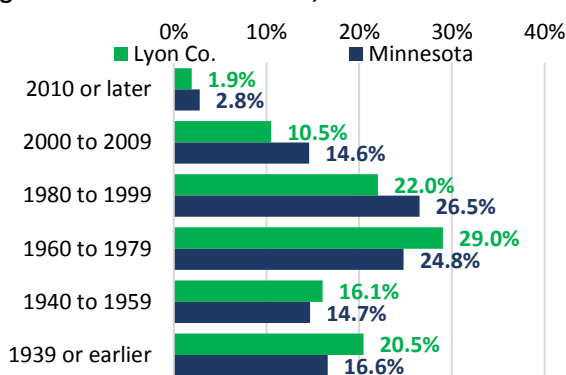

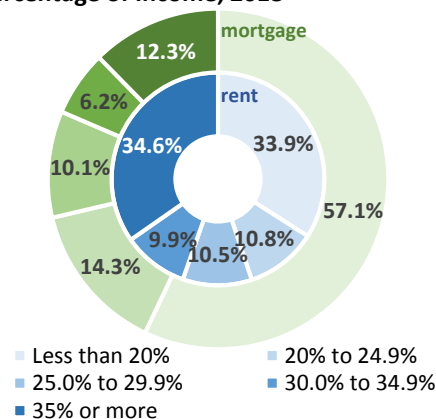

OCCUPATIONS

At \$17.66 in 2019, wages were lower in Region 8 than the state. Overall, Region 8 had the 3rd lowest median hourly wage level of the 13 economic development regions in the state. Wages were highest for management occupations (\$40.14) and lowest for food preparation and serving related jobs (\$11.44) (see Table 11).

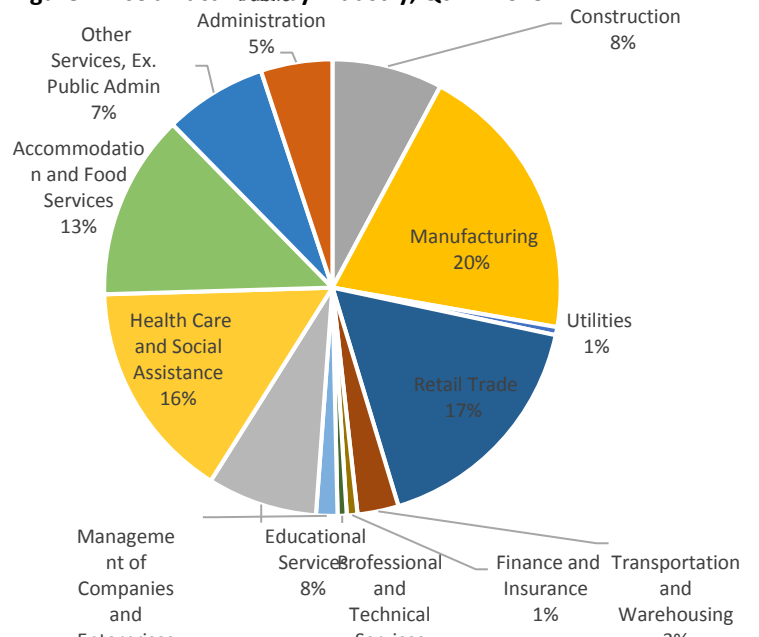
JOB VACANCY SURVEY

Lyon Co. is a part of Region 8, which includes Cottonwood, Jackson, Lincoln, Lyon, Murray, Nobles, Pipestone, Redwood, and Rock County. There were 2707 job vacancies posted by employers in the 2nd Quarter of 2019, indicating extensive opportunity in the region, with openings across several occupations and industries (see Figure 14).

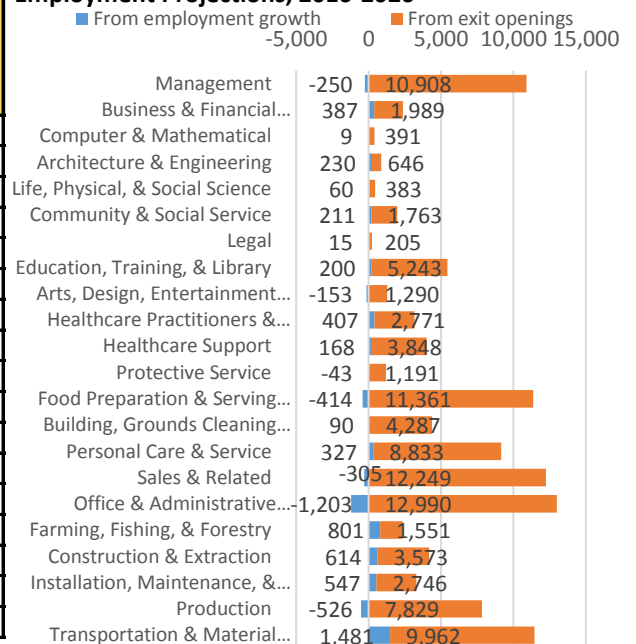

ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

After losing jobs over the past year, Lyon Co. had the 31st largest economy of the 87 counties in the state. Lyon Co. was the 66th fastest growing in the past year and the 76th fastest growing since 2013. From 2013 to 2018, employers in Lyon Co. cut jobs, but lagged the state's 7.0% growth rate.

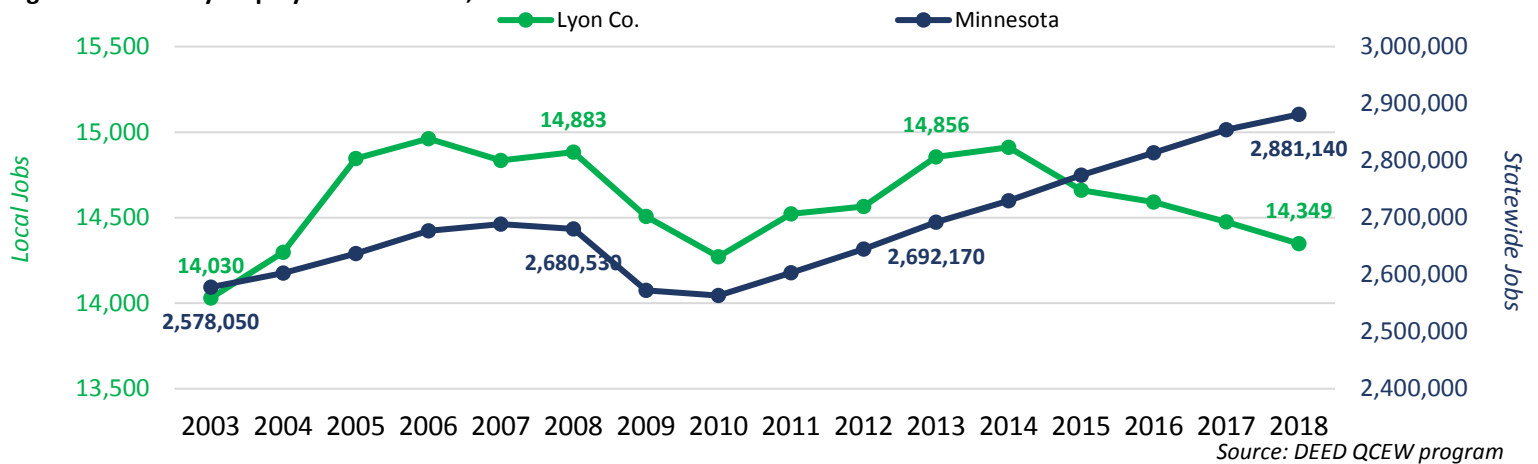

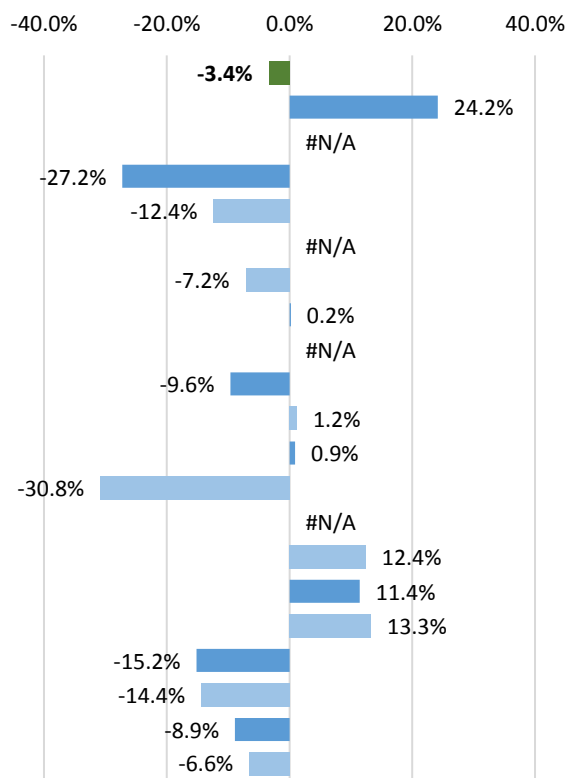
