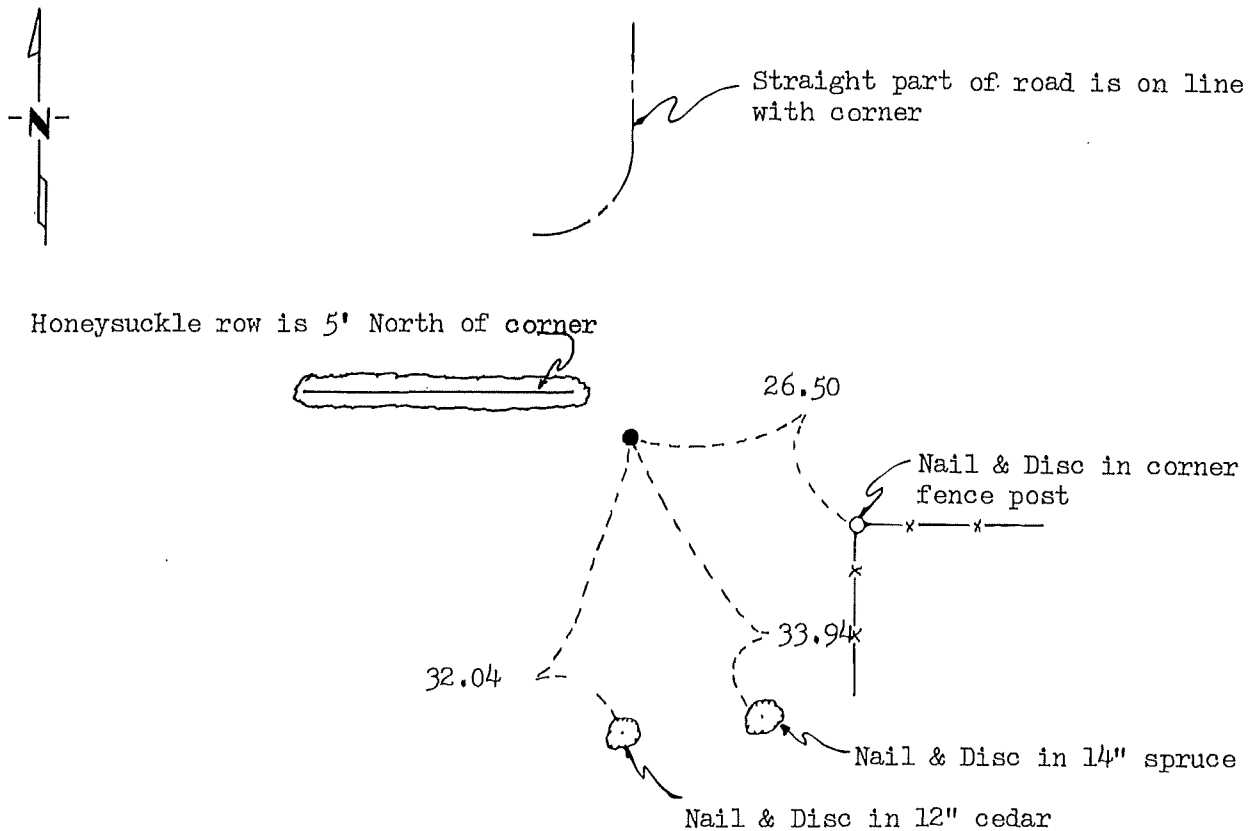

Statement of Evidence:

The corner was originally established in the public land survey which was completed in Tenhassen Township in 1854.

A survey done in May of 1917 by County Surveyor George E. Sawyer, identified the corner as stone in mound and remains of stake. Crockery 30" deep and grey granite 15" x 10" x 9" with "+" at surface.

The Martin County Highway Department in 1978 found stone "+" (10" deep) and 3/4" iron pipe (protrudes 2"). Remaining ties are as follows:

26.50 S.E. = Corner fence post

33.94 S.E. = 14" spruce

32.04 S. = 12" cedar

E.-W. Honeysuckle row is 5' North of corner.

On 10/10/79, I found stone with "+" (10" deep) with a 3/4 square rebar over stone.
