Kidnapping and Motor Vehicle Theft Hollywood Casino

On Wednesday, April 2, 2025, our officers received a report from the St. Charles City Police Department, reference to a kidnapping and theft of a motor vehicle that took place at approximately 4:30 PM, from the Hollywood Casino, located at 777 Casino Center Drive, Maryland Heights, MO.

The victim, a 74 years of age female reported to the St. Charles City Police Department that she was kidnapped, held at gunpoint and was forced to drive the suspect, identified as:

Darryl Anthony Saddler
62 years of age
St. Louis, MO 63147

To an ATM in St. Charles, MO. Once there, he demanded the victim to withdraw money and then stole her motor vehicle from her to flee from the area. The victim then contacted the St. Charles City Police Department and provided them with a description of Saddler and her vehicle. St. Charles City Police Department was able to quickly locate the victim's vehicle and then took Saddler into custody nearby.

On Thursday, April 3, 2025, the case was presented to the St. Louis County Prosecuting Attorney's Office, Darryl Saddler has been charged with Vehicle Hijacking – Serious Physical injury/Deadly Weapon/Dangerous Instrument/Vulnerable Person – Class A Felony, two counts of Armed Criminal Action – Class U Felony, and Kidnapping – 1st Degree – Class B Felony, with no bond.

The St. Charles County Prosecuting Attorney's Office issued the additional charges on Saddler, Kidnapping 1st Degree – Felony, Robbery 1st Degree – Felony, Unlawful Possession of a Firearm – Felony, Stealing of a Motor Vehicle – Felony, and Armed Criminal Action – Felony, with a \$100,000 cash only bond. Saddler is currently being held at the St. Charles City Police Department holding facility. A photo of Saddler is attached.

Saddler has a substantial criminal history that includes:

- Rape – Felony
- Robbery 1st – Felony
- Burglary 1st – Felony
- Bank Robbery – Felony
- Unlawful Possession of a Firearm – Felony

The Maryland Heights Police Department is working in partnership with the St. Charles City Police Department to bring this case to a successful resolution for the victim.
