# Registration Opens July 1 for Fall Electronic Recycling and Paper Shredding

## Electronic Recycling

Safely discard of your electronic junk! This event allows residents (no businesses, please) to safely dispose of computers, radios, cameras, VCRs, CD players, nearly anything that has a cord or battery. Most items are free to recycle, but some fees apply to certain items. There is a \$20 - \$50 fee to dispose of TVs. MRC accepts cash or check as payment. Some items that are not accepted are: VHS tapes, data tapes, floppy disks, anything leaking oil or acid, alkaline batteries, light bulbs, thermostats, smoke detectors, gas containers, and capacitors.

Participation is limited to the first 375 residents. By way of a grant provided from St. Louis County Department of Public Health to encourage CRT (cathode ray tube) television recycling, the first 18 residents to register per session that would like to recycle a CRT TV will have the \$20-30 fee waived.

A file-sized or "bankers" box is approximately 12"W x 15"L x 10"H and roughly the size of a box of office printer paper and the capacity is equal to two full paper grocery bags. Participation is limited to the first 300 residents who register. Addresses will be checked to confirm Maryland Heights residency.

## Kids Learn Important Lessons at Safety Town

One of the most talked about summer programs in Maryland Heights is known as Safety Town! Safety Town is a nationally recognized preschool safety program for children ages 3.5 to 5 years of age. Each two week session is taught by DARE Officer Bob Heitert with the help of teenage counselors. This mini-camp program has been a summer tradition for many families for over thirty years!

During their two week session, kids will learn about:

- Stranger danger safety
- Walking and Traffic safety
- Pedestrian safety
- Fire safety
- Poisons
- Bus safety
- Bicycle safety
- Water safety
- Gun safety

Safety Town provides "hands-on" safety education with child-size settings complete with buildings, crosswalks, traffic signals and

traffic signs. Kids can practice and demonstrate some of their safety skills learned in Safety Town through the use of driving child-size vehicles and bicycles. Children will also receive classroom instruction on basic safety topics.

The skills taught at Safety Town will empower children with the ability to avoid needless accidents and instill safety habits at an early age.

There are three sessions of Safety Town available this summer. Parents should register their children for one session; all three sessions will have identical lesson plans. Safety Town will take place Monday - Friday from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. at the Maryland Heights Community Center on the following dates:

- Session 1: June 14 - 25
- Session 2: July 5 - 16
- Session 3: July 19 - 30

Fireworks are **ILLEGAL** in the City of Maryland Heights.



Violators will face a fine of up to \$1,000. (Per Ordinance 9-2)

Fireworks are illegal within Maryland Heights as this is a St. Louis County ordinance which is enforced by all municipalities throughout St. Louis County.

Please remember that 911 is NOT for reporting fireworks! 911 lines need to be utilized for emergencies that include life threatening health issues and accidents or crimes that are in progress. If you call 911 to report a non-emergency, those who need our help the most could experience a delay in receiving the assistance they need. A few minutes of a delay could mean life or death for someone who is needing help.

If you need to report fireworks, please call the non-emergency police line at (314) 298-8700. Please be patient, as our police dispatchers could be simultaneously dealing with emergency situations.

Fireworks can cause serious burns, eye injuries, loss of body parts and even death. Individuals suffering from sound sensitivities can have episodes triggered by loud explosions caused by fireworks.

One reason that fireworks are illegal in St. Louis County is the fire risk they pose to houses. Additionally, the noise can cause distress in many pets and unused fireworks contain toxic ingredients.

Now is the time to think up creative alternatives: bubbles, glow sticks, light shows, etc. Have a safe and fun-filled 4th of July!

# Digital Communications 101

## How to: Identify Email Scams

If you think there might be something "phishy" going on in your email inbox, you could be right! Phishing is the fraudulent practice of sending emails pretending to be from reputable companies or individuals in an attempt to get the receiver to reveal personal information. According to the FBI, phishing was the most common type of cybercrime in 2020. The Communications Division is partnering with the Maryland Heights Police Department to educate residents on email safety. We will discuss a variety of email scams that exist and how to identify them. We will also give tips on how to get rid of unwanted emails and take a look at the (safe!) email updates available from the City.

## Council Minutes

The following is a summary of action taken at the April 1 City Council meeting. The meeting on April 15 was cancelled. For complete meeting minutes, visit [www.marylandheights.com/minutes](http://www.marylandheights.com/minutes).

### April 1:

- Approved a resolution amending the 2020 Budget by increasing the General Fund Revenues by \$1,900,000 to recognize Cares Act Funding, increasing the Dorsett TIF expenditures by \$130,000, increasing the sources and uses of funds in the Westport Plaza TIF Fund for financing activities, transferring funds between programs and project expenditures in the general fund and capital improvements fund, and providing for a transfer of funds from the general fund to the reserve fund.
- Approved an ordinance amending Article VI of Chapter 2 of the Maryland Heights Municipal Code by amending Section 2-476 to adopt a Records Management Program.
- Approved an ordinance amending Chapter 21, Police, of the Municipal Code by repealing Sections 21-203 and 21-206 and enacting new Sections 21-203, Promotional Examination and Section 21-206, Interview, in lieu thereof.
- Approved an ordinance amending the Municipal Code to provide for an exception to applicable sections of the zoning code due to the Covid-19 pandemic of March 2020 (Petition of City of Maryland Heights).
