






MIDDLETOWN TOWN COUNCIL MEETING


October 6, 2009


The Middletown Town Council met at its regular meeting on October 6, 2009 at 7:00 P.M. in the council meeting room. President Jake Smith called the meeting to order. Clerk-Treasurer Jim Hanson noted that council members, Dan Fountain and Tim Mundell were also present. Council members Jim Mundell and Lisa Hicks-Smith were absent to attend the IACT Conference being held in French Lick. After the pledge to the flag, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

1. Jake reminded everyone present that this week is Fire Prevention Week.
2. Tracy Harrison announced that the Water Board would meet at 12:15 P.M. on October 7, 2009 in the training room. Also she informed that the Utility Department had received \$1000 Grant from the Henry County Community Foundation. The money is to be used for the purchase of Emergency Radios.
3. Police Chief Randy Wray stated that Halloween would be observed on Saturday, October 31, 2009 between the hours of 6:00-9:00 P.M. Randy also discussed the request from EMS Chief Phil Chandler for a key-pad system to be installed in the back hall entrance door to the police side. This would allow the emergency personnel access to the copy machine as well as access to the dispatch area to pick up run sheets without having to go outside. The matter was taken under advisement.
4. Clerk-Treasurer Jim Hanson presented a resolution to allow a temporary loan from the Sewage Utility to the General Fund in the amount of \$20,000. The loan was approved by the council. Hanson also informed that the town had received the June draw from the county auditor last Friday. He reported to council that the Sewage Utility had received \$6849.93 with the tax draw for sewage liens that had been filed. In another matter he informed that the pad for the recycle bins behind the city building had been paved. Finally, in the absence of David Real, Utility Superintendent, he told council that the trucks purchased by the utility department were scheduled to arrive by the end of next week.
5. There being nothing further to come before the council, the meeting was adjourned.
