MIDDLETOWN TOWN COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
APRIL 2, 2013

The Middletown Town Council met for its regularly scheduled meeting on April 2, 2013 in the Public Meeting Room at 653 Locust Street, Middletown, Indiana at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was opened by Town Council President Betty Riley leading those present in the pledge to the flag. Clerk-Treasurer Drew Cooper noted that Council Members Betty Riley, Bill Harrison, Gary Kendall, Shelly Kimmerling and Norm Purdue were present. Counsel for the town council Joel Harvey was present.

1. Utilities Superintendent Tracy Harrison presented an estimate from E&B Paving for repairing Progress Street between 9th & 10th Streets, and Maple Street near the intersection with 8th Street. The Council requested that Harrison seek more bids on the project and present them at the next meeting.

2. Norm Purdue moved to authorize the Utilities Superintendent to donate the flashing stop light that was replaced at the intersection of 5th & Locust Streets to the Middletown-Fall Creek Township Historical Society. Shelly Kimmerling seconded. Purdue, Kimmerling, Betty Riley, and Gary Kendall voted yes. Bill Harrison voted no. The motion passed.

3. Norm Purdue moved to authorize the Utilities Superintendent to remove the three 15-minute parking signs from the downtown area. Bill Harrison seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

4. Norm Purdue moved to authorize the Utilities Superintendent to enter into an agreement with Alan Ash to provide services as Waste Water Operator for \$1,000 per month. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

5. Norm Purdue moved to authorize the Utilities Superintendent to hire 4 part-time youth employees for the summer at minimum wage for a period of 8 weeks. Bill Harrison seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

6. Betty Riley moved to promote Utility Workers Carl Spears and Sam Hersberger to the next pay grade as per the recommendation of the Utilities Superintendent. Shelly Kimmerling seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

7. President Betty Riley announced the appointments of David Weir and Michael Cooper to the Civic Center Board. Weir and Cooper replace Mary Hayes and Lisa Hicks respectively.

8. Township resident Steve Peckinpaugh made a short presentation to the council on the status of the County's ordinances concerning establishing new confined animal feeding operations (CAFO) within Henry County and concluded by presenting a proposed resolution to be reviewed by Council and if approved, signed and submitted to the Henry County Commissioner from the Middletown Council.

9. There being nothing further to come before council, the meeting was adjourned.
