MIDDLETOWN TOWN COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
JUNE 11, 2013

The Middletown Town Council met for its regularly scheduled meeting on June 11, 2013 in the Public Meeting Room at 653 Locust Street, Middletown, Indiana at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was opened by Town Council President Betty Riley leading those present in the pledge to the flag. Clerk-Treasurer Drew Cooper noted that Council Members Betty Riley, Bill Harrison, Gary Kendall, Shelly Kimmerling and Norm Purdue were present. Counsel for the town council Joel Harvey was present.

1. Norm Purdue moved that Middletown not allow residents outside of corporation limits to "tap in" to the Middletown sewer system. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

2. A public hearing was held on the 5<sup>th</sup> Street Storm Sewer Project. Representatives from the engineering firm of Butler, Fairmain, & Seufert (BFS) were present to answer any questions. There were no questions or comments from the public.



3. Norm Purdue moved to authorize Council President Betty Riley to sign the application for a loan of \$2,226,500 from the State Revolving Fund (SRF). Shelly Kimmerling seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Riley signed the application and the BFS engineers will submit it to the SRF before the June 30 deadline.


4. Norm Purdue moved that Middletown select financial plan A for the 5<sup>th</sup> Street Storm Sewer Project, as presented by the town's financial advisors, Umbaugh & Associates, at the previous meeting. The plan calls for no increase in storm sewer fees to residents. The plan calls for the town to pay off the \$450,000 currently owed on the last sewer project using the existing cash in the Storm Water Utility Operating Fund before beginning payments on the \$2,226,500 loan from the SRF. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.


5. Norm Purdue moved to table the discussion on possibly raising water rates. Betty Riley seconded the motion. Bill Harrison voted no. All other council members voted yes. The motion passed.

6. Gary Kendall moved to authorize Middletown Police Officer Mike Vacarro to begin fundraising for the purchase of a new police dog. Shelly Kimmerling seconded. Betty Riley voted no. All other council members voted yes. The motion passed.

7. There being nothing further to come before council, the meeting was adjourned.
