MIDDLETOWN TOWN COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
JUNE 18, 2013

The Middletown Town Council met for its regularly scheduled meeting on June 18, 2013 in the Public Meeting Room at 653 Locust Street, Middletown, Indiana at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was opened by Town Council President Betty Riley leading those present in the pledge to the flag. Clerk-Treasurer Drew Cooper noted that Council Members Betty Riley, Bill Harrison, Gary Kendall, Shelly Kimmerling and Norm Purdue were present. Counsel for the town council Joel Harvey was present.

1. Bill Harrison moved to pass Ordinance 2-2013 AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PLACEMENT OR DEPOSIT OF GRASS CLIPPINGS OR OTHER YARD REFUSE ON PUBLIC STREETS. Gary Kendall seconded. The motion passed unanimously. The council voted unanimously to suspend the rules and pass the ordinance on all three readings.

2. A discussion was held on increasing the rate charged for water by Middletown Utilities. A consensus was formed to increase the rate 5% now and 5% more next year. Council President Betty Riley instructed the town attorney and the Clerk-Treasurer to draw up an ordinance accordingly.


3. Norm Purdue moved to authorize the Clerk-Treasurer to establish a 5th Street Storm Sewer Project Fund and transfer \$355,000 from the Stormwater Operating Fund to this fund. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.


4. Norm Purdue moved to authorize the Clerk-Treasurer to transfer \$100,000 from the Sewer Operating Fund to the Stormwater Bond Reserve Fund. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.


5. Bill Harrison moved to rescind the approval given at the last council meeting for Middletown Police Officer Mike Vacarro to begin fundraising for a new police dog. Betty Riley seconded. Shelly Kimmerling voted no. Gary Kendall, Bill Harrison, Betty Riley, and Norm Purdue voted yes. The motion passed.




7. There being nothing further to come before council, the meeting was adjourned.
