MIDDLETOWN TOWN COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
AUGUST 6, 2013

The Middletown Town Council met for its regularly scheduled meeting on August 6, 2013 in the Public Meeting Room at 653 Locust Street, Middletown, Indiana at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was opened by Town Council President Betty Riley leading those present in the pledge to the flag. Clerk-Treasurer Drew Cooper noted that Council Members Betty Riley, Bill Harrison, Gary Kendall, Shelly Kimmerling and Norm Purdue were present. Counsel for the town council Joel Harvey was present.

1. Norm Purdue moved to hire Fred Shock for the position of Middletown Police Officer, as recommended by the Town Marshall. Shock will begin in the first week of September at the Deputy 3 pay rate of \$13.73 per hour. Shock will be promoted to Deputy 5 as of the first payroll in January, 2014 and be paid \$16.38 per hour. Shelly Kimmerling seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

2. Norm Purdue moved to authorize the Utilities Superintendent to purchase a "locator" for locating underground pipes before digging, the price not to exceed \$3,500. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.


3. A public hearing was held on proposed ORDINANCE NO. 3-2013 AN ORDINANCE INCREASING RATES CHARGED TO CUSTOMERS OF THE MIDDLETOWN WATER UTILITY. There were no comments from the public on the proposed ordinance. Norm Purdue moved to adopt the proposed ordinance on its first reading. Shelly Kimmerling seconded. The motion passed unanimously.


4. Bill Harrison moved to authorize the payment of \$17,000 to Scott's Computer Service for re-installation and upgrading of the Municipal Building's computer network server, the payment to come from the Cumulative Capital Improvement Fund. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

5. Norm Purdue moved to authorize the payment of \$6,745.75 to Scott's Computer Service for labor expended and Dell Support during the Municipal Building computer network server crash on the weekend of July 20, the payment to come from the Cumulative Capital Improvement Fund. Shelly Kimmerling seconded. The motion passed unanimously.


6. A committee was formed to investigate options available to the Town of Middletown when the AT&T contract expires in July of 2014. Drew Cooper, Norm Purdue, and Betty Riley volunteered to be on the committee. They will meet once a month through the end of the year and report their findings in January of 2014.

7. There being nothing further to come before council, the meeting was adjourned.


