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MIDDLETOWN TOWN COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
MARCH 3, 2015

The Middletown Town Council met for its regularly scheduled meeting on March 3, 2015 in the Public Meeting Room at 653 Locust Street, Middletown, Indiana at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was opened by Town Council President Betty Riley leading those present in the pledge to the flag. Clerk-Treasurer Drew Cooper noted that Council Members Betty Riley, Dave Wagner, Shelly Kimmerling, and Norm Purdue were present. Council Member Gary Kendall was absent. Greg Crider was filling in for Town Attorney Joel Harvey.

1. Betty Riley moved to authorize Deputy Amanda Kirby to take home a Middletown Police Vehicle after each shift she works and return it the next shift she works. Shelly Kimmerling seconded. Dave Wagner voted no. Shelly Kimmerling, Norm Purdue, and Betty Riley voted yes. The motion passed.
2. Utilities Superintendent Tracy Harrison announced that she will advertise for bids on several pieces of old unneeded utility equipment, including vehicles, and that the sealed bids will be opened at the first town council meeting in April.
3. Betty Riley moved to authorize the Utilities Superintendent to hire Delaware Glass & Mirror to replace 6 insulated glass windows on the Municipal Building for a cost of \$3,475.00, with the cost to be paid from the Cumulative Capital Development Fund. Norm Purdue seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
4. Dave Wagner moved to authorize the Utilities Superintendent to order a 2015 Ford F-350 dump truck from McCrocklin Ford for \$36,683.80. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
5. A public hearing was held on the proposed Water Treatment Plant Replacement Project. Brad King, of Butler-Fairman-Seafurt, gave a short presentation on the project, followed by comments from the public.
6. Betty Riley moved to adopt ORDINANCE 2-2015 FAIR HOUSING ORDINANCE. Norm Purdue seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
7. Norm Purdue moved to approve a service agreement with H.J. Umbaugh & Associates to provide financial services in calculating the quarterly Electric Utility Tracking Factor. Dave Wagner seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
8. There being nothing further to come before council, the meeting was adjourned.
