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MIDDLETOWN TOWN COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
NOVEMBER 17, 2015

The Middletown Town Council met for its regularly scheduled meeting on November 17, 2015 in the Public Meeting Room at 653 Locust Street, Middletown, Indiana at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was opened by Town Council President Betty Riley leading those present in the pledge to the flag. Clerk-Treasurer Drew Cooper noted that Council Members Betty Riley, Shelly Kimmerling, Dave Wagner Gary Kendall, and Norm Purdue were present. Town Attorney Joel Harvey was present.

1. Norm Purdue moved to direct the Utilities Superintendent to change all the key locks on the Civic Center. Dave Wagner seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
2. Dave Wagner moved to authorize the Clerk-Treasurer to pay 3D Company, Inc. the amounts specified in Contractor's Progress Estimate Number 13 (\$25,660.50 from SRF and \$2,552.52 from local funds), providing State Revolving Fund approval and correct change order documentation. Norm Purdue seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
3. The Town Council President directed the Town Attorney to investigate the claim from 3D Company, Inc. that the method used during the 5<sup>th</sup> Street Stormsewer Project to pay them for PVC pipe was unfair and resulted in them being underpaid by \$13,614.16.
4. The Clerk-Treasurer read Resolution 2015-11-17-1 INTERLOCAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT AND CONTRACT BETWEEN THE TOWNSHIP OF FALLCREEK AND THE TOWN OF MIDDLETOWN LOCATED IN HENRY COUNTY, INDIANA. Betty Riley moved to adopt Resolution 2015-11-17-1. Gary Kendall seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
5. Betty Riley moved to suspend the rules and perform the second reading of Ordinance 2015-5 by name and number only. Dave Wagner seconded. The motion passed unanimously. The Clerk-Treasurer read ORDINANCE NO. 2015-5 AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A POLICE PUBLIC SAFETY LOIT FUND AND A FIRE PUBLIC SAFETY LOIT FUND by name and number only. Betty Riley moved to approve the second reading of the ordinance. Norm Purdue seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
6. Dave Wagner moved to suspend the rules and perform the second reading of Ordinance 2015-6 by name and number only. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously. The Clerk-Treasurer read ORDINANCE NO. 2015-6 AMENDING ORDINANCE 03-18-2008-2 AN ORDINANCE INCREASING THE ELECTRIC RATES CHARGED TO CUSTOMERS OF MIDDLETOWN, INDIANA by name and number only. Betty Riley moved to approve the second reading of the ordinance. Norm Purdue seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
7. Betty Riley moved to suspend the rules and perform the second reading of Ordinance 2015-7 by name and number only. Dave Wagner seconded. The motion passed unanimously. The Clerk-Treasurer read ORDINANCE NO. 2015-7 AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING STOP SIGNS ON LOCUST STREET IN THE TOWN OF MIDDLETOWN, INDIANA. (AMENDMENT TO THE MIDDLETOWN TRAFFIC SCHEDULE, CHAPTER 74, SCHEDULE I OF THE MIDDLETOWN TOWN CODE) by name and number only. Dave Wagner moved to approve the second reading of the ordinance. Shelly Kimmerling seconded. Dave Wagner, Shelly Kimmerling, and Gary Kendall voted yes. Betty Riley and Norm Purdue voted no. The motion passed.



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8. Betty Riley moved to suspend the rules and perform the second reading of Ordinance 2015-8 by name and number only. Dave Wagner seconded. The motion passed unanimously. The Clerk-Treasurer read ORDINANCE NO. 2015-8 AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PARKING IN CERTAIN AREAS IN THE TOWN OF MIDDLETOWN, INDIANA by name and number only. Betty Riley moved to approve the second reading of the ordinance. Dave Wagner seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

9. The Clerk-Treasurer introduced and read ORDINANCE NO. 2015-9 AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 3-2013 AN ORDINANCE INCREASING RATES CHARGED TO CUSTOMERS OF THE MIDDLETOWN WATER UTILITY.

10. Dave Wagner moved to schedule a special town council meeting and public hearing on Tuesday, December 8, 7:00 p.m. in order to adopt Ordinance 2015-9 in time for the State Revolving Fund to close on the Water Treatment Plant Replacement Project bonds before the end of the year. Gary Kendall seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

There being nothing further to come before council, the meeting was adjourned.
