MIDDLETOWN TOWN COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES AUGUST 16, 2016

The Middletown Town Council met on August 16, 2016 in the Public Meeting Room at 653 Locust Street, Middletown, Indiana at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was opened by Town Council President Jake Smith leading those present in the pledge to the flag. Clerk-Treasurer Drew Cooper noted that Council Members Jake Smith, Donita Chambless, Gary Kendall, Dave Wagner, and Betty Riley were present. Town Attorney Joel Harvey was present.

- 1. Peggy Stefandel, of the Concerned Citizens of Henry County, gave a presentation on the negative effects of wind farms. She requested that the town council pass a resolution stating Middletown is against any wind farms in Henry County. Dave Wagner suggested that, in order to help the council determine the opinions of Middletown citizens; a tally sheet be kept in the utility office for citizens to sign for or against wind farms. The Town Council President tabled any action on a resolution until the next meeting.
- 2. Dave Wagner moved to authorize the Town Marshal to accept the donation of a second police dog and to pay for the shipping of the dog from Europe at a maximum cost of \$800. This money to be paid from the K-9 Fund. Donita Chambless seconded. Dave Wagner, Donita Chambless, and Jake Smith voted yes. Gary Kendall and Betty Riley voted no. The motion passed.
- 3. Donita Chambless moved to terminate the employment of Danyail Robinson as a dispatcher. Betty Riley seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 4. The Town Council President reported he has scheduled a meeting with Henry County EDC President Corey Murphy and the Middletown Redevelopment Commission on August 23. The Clerk-Treasurer will post the meeting as a joint public meeting of the Town Council and Redevelopment Commission.
- 5. A public hearing was held on the proposed 2017 budget. Questions from the audience were answered by the Clerk-Treasurer. The vote to adopt the budget is scheduled for the October 18 town council meeting.
- 6. Dave Wagner moved to authorize the Civic Center Board President to hire Improvements Unlimited for \$2,631.71 to replace the steel door on the Civic Center Building. Gary Kendall seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

There being nothing further to come	before council, the meeting was adjourned.
