



MIDDLETOWN TOWN COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES


The Middletown Town Council held a meeting on June 20th 2023.
Drew Cooper and Gary Kendall were absent


1. Chloe Harman discussed the parking situation at 10th and High. It is difficult for cars to turn the corner when vehicles are parked so close the intersection.
2. The council heard a presentation from the Madison County Organization of Governments. They are a non profit organization that receives Federal funding to deal with transportation issues in the area. Dave Wagner motioned and Dan Fountain seconded passing a resolution to join the organization at no cost or obligation to the Town. Motion carried 3-0.
3. Ordinance 06-20-2023-1, which allows police officers to work overtime hours at the Chiefs discretion at a rate of 50.00/hour, was read on its first reading. This money would be reimbursed by the Federal Government. Dan Fountain motioned and Dave Wagner seconded approving the ordinance. Motion carried 3-0.
4. The council agreed to table the sewer bond ordinance until the next meeting.
5. Resolution 06-20-2023-2 was presented. It formally accepts the Preliminary Engineering Report for the wastewater project. Dave Wagner motioned and Dan Fountain seconded approving the resolution. Motion carried 3-0.
6. Dave Wagner motioned and Dan Fountain seconded approving Bowen Contractors as the tentative provider for the Wastewater project.
7. Dan Fountain motioned and Dave Wagner seconded paying DC Construction 90,952.36 for paving work recently completed. Motion carried 3-0.
8. Thomas Ballenger of 932 Progress was present to discuss issues that he was having in trying to get electric service to his building rewired.
9. After discussion, Dan Fountain motioned and Dave Wagner seconded the Town renouncing any claim of ownership that the town has to the clock hanging on the old bank building at the corner of 5th and Locust.
10. Dan Fountain motioned and Dave Wagner seconded appointing Gilbert Zapfe as a Code Enforcement Officer. Motion carried 3-0.
11. Dan Fountain motioned and Dave Wagner seconded allowing Carl Spears and Clint Ade to attend a Rural Water Alliance conference at a cost of 450.00


There being nothing further brought before the council, the meeting was adjourned.
